

THE BAYHAM WOMEN'S INSTITUTE was organized in the home of Mrs. (Dr.) A.B. RIddell, in the Village of Richmond, in the summer of 1907 by the East Elgin District Officers, Mrs. Dr. Anna Backus, Aylmer, the President; and Mrs. D. D. Finch, Mapleton, 1st Vice President. My Mother, Mrs. Finch, drove her horse and buggy from Mapleton to Aylmer and picked up Mrs. (Dr.) Backus and arrived in time for dinner with Mrs. Riddell; and I, well remember how she told of the beauty around these Richmond Hills.

The Officers elected were Mrs. (Dr.) A.B. Riddell, President, and Miss Addie Cook, Secretary. We do not know the exact date of this Meeting but the first Meeting reported in the District Books was held on November 13th, 1907, with an attendance of 15. An address was given by Miss Cook on "Womanhood", and Mrs. (Dr.) A.B. Riddell demonstrated the making of a Carrot Pudding and at the next meeting, Mrs. Alex Grant and Miss Bertha Knott gave good addresses.

As the Institute Books from 1907 - 1917 are missing I had to rely on the District books for the work of the Institute during these 10 years. The Meetings were held in the Church and the homes with an average attendance of 20. There was one social evening held each year, with either a Debate or Spelling Match. On December 8th, 1908, the Debate was "Resolved that Thrifty House Wives were and are of more benefit to the Country than Politicians". There is no record of which side won.

Another time the Debate was "Resolved that the Influence of Heridity is greater than Invirment". The affirmative was taken by Dr. A.B. Riddell and Mrs. George Procunier and the Negative by Mrs. Neil McConkey and Miss Louise Mitchell. The Judges,
Mr. Henry Godwin, Ebert Kinsey and Granville Mills, decided in favor of the Negative. The Chairman for the evening was Mr. Henry Godwin and Home made Candy was served.
