MAJOR FRED A. PROCUNIER

Son of Mr. and Mrs. George A. Procunier, was born in Bayham and attended Richmond Public School and Aylmer High School. He is a graduate in Medicine of Toronto University. He enlisted in the Army Medical Corps in June 1940, and received miltiary training at Niagara-on-the-Lake, at Camp Nanaimo, B.C., and at Camp Debert, N.S. He went overseas in July 1943 with the 21st Cdn. Field Dressing Station. Later he was transferred to the 11th Cdn. Field Ambulance. In June 1945, he went with the Cdn. Army into Normandy and served at Caen, Falaise, Rouen, Dieppe and Antwerp. His unit was the first medical unit to cross the Beneland Canal in the Allied Drive in Holland. Later they were sent into Germany. After V-E Day Major Procunier and his unit were given supervision over seven German hospitals in Northern Germany. At present he is with the 18th Field Ambulance in Holland. His wife, the former Alma Lynde, and son, reside at Myrtle Station, Ontario.



CAPT. GORDON W. PROCUNIER
