## Helen McKercher honored

TORONTO (CP)— Helert McKercher, who retired last October as director of the home economics branch of the Ontario department of agriculture, was honored this week at a dinner and presentation given by the Women's Institutes (WI) of Ontario.

The WI has set up a scholarship in Miss McKercher's
name to be given to future
home economics students. So
far \$10,000 has been raised towards the scholarship, a WI
spokesman said.

Miss McKercher, a resident of Stratford, Ont., interned in dietetics at the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto and Ottawa Civic Hospital.

In 1931, she joined the WI branch of the Ontario department of agriculture and was home economist for the counties of Wellington, Dufferin, Middlesex and Perth.

In 1943, she enlisted in the Women's Royal Canadian Naval Service as one of four dietitians acting as advisers on food preparation for Canadian naval ships and establishments during the Second World War.

Discharged as a lieutenant in 1945, Miss McKercher returned to the department of agriculture as county home economist for Welland, Lincoln and Heldimand

and Haldimand.

A year later she enrolled at
Cornell University where she
completed her bachelor of science degree in foods and nutrition and her masters in extension education.

In 1948, she returned to the department of agriculture and spent two years as supervisor of home economics education.

Three years later, Miss McKercher joined the federal department of fisheries where she became chief of consumer services

She served with the provincial department of agriculture as its director of home economics from 1956.
