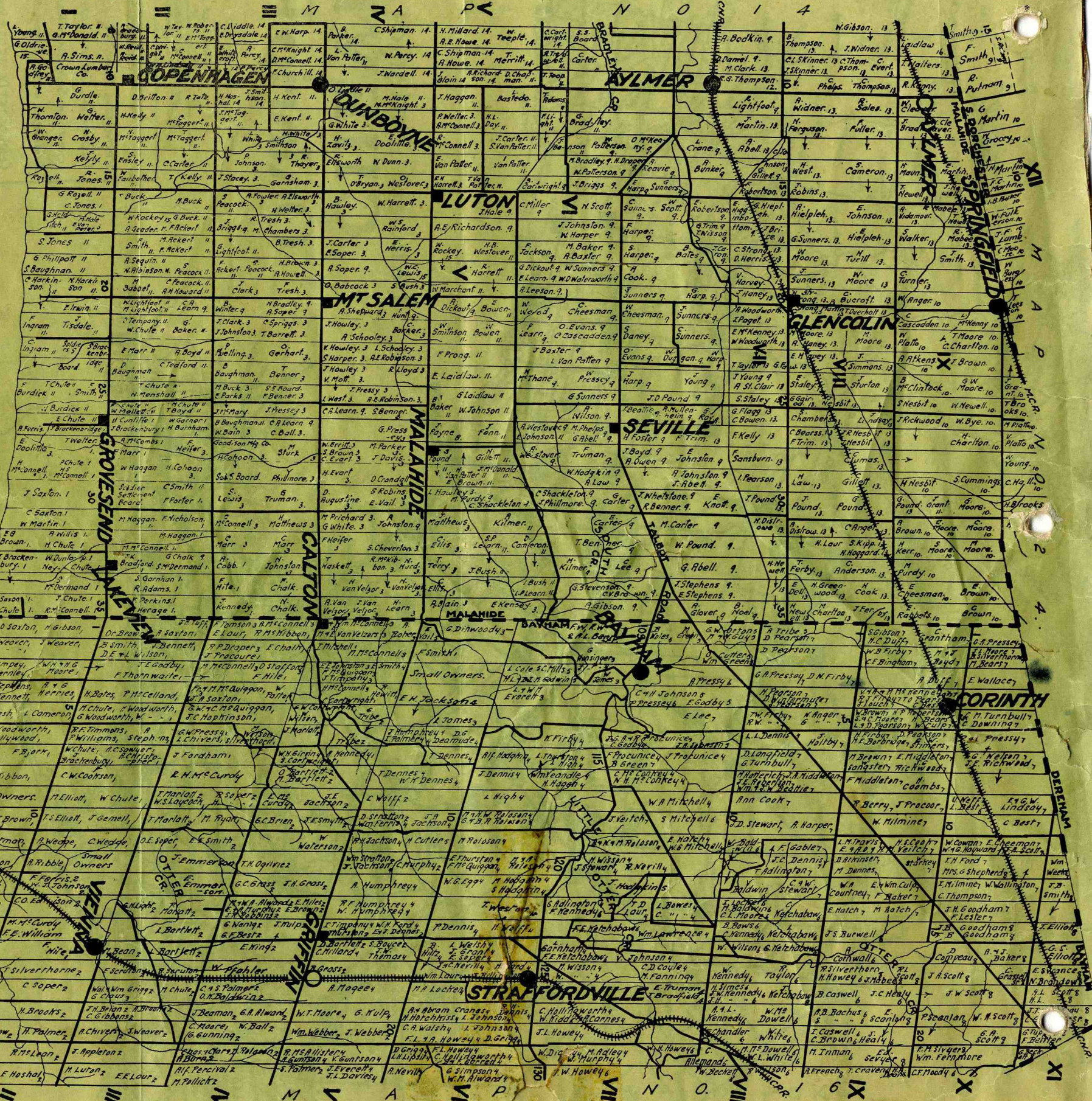

CALTON SKATING RINK

During winter 1940-41, a number of men of this community cut trees in McConnell's gully (now owned by Charles Phillips) to get logs to saw into lumber for the purpose of making a board fence enclosure for a rink. The site of this rink was on George Roszell's place (now owned by Charles Phillips). For the first year, water for flooding was taken from George Roszell's well. The following year Emery Chalk donated a pump and pipe for flooding. The pump was installed in the gully on Emery Chalk's farm.

This rink afforded the people of this district a large measure of fun for several years.

A number of Carnivals were held at which many and sundry prizes were won by the winners of races, etc.

Hockey was also played with neighbouring teams. At one time Calton team won the cup at the final play-off. This cup was stored at the Calton Garage and was lost when fire destroyed the garage in January, 1952.
