The work of the Tweedsmuir History has now been separated from the committee on Historical Research. 1962.

The Custodian of the History Book is now known as the Curator.

In 1964 our dues have risen from 50¢ to \$1.00 per yr.

FISCAL YEAR 1964-65

Our expenses on our "Good Neighbour Project" for last fiscal year were the highest ever, amounting to over \$53.00. Annual meetings were changed from March to April.

In June Mr. Lyal Tate showed slides on Africa, especially Rhodesia, picturing the tobacco industry.

At October meeting it was decided to change our regular meeting date to the second Wednesday in the month instead of the second Tuesday.

On May 12, 1964, our members went to St. Thomas Steak house for supper. After supper we went through "Elgin Manor" the new County House situated about 5 miles west of St. Thomas. It is not yet ready for opening.

FISCAL YEAR 1965-66

During this year our members assisted at the County Museum tea, also at Elgin Manor and the Well-Baby Clinic in Aymer. We donated cookies to the St. Thomas, Ontario Hospital Carnival Day.

Cash donations were made to the following: St. Thomas, Elgin Retarded children Association, Child Health Clinic, Community Hall, N.W. Territories, 8th grade award at Calton School and kept up our "Good Neighbour" project.

Some of our members went on the district bus trip to Detroit Zoological gardens.

In November we held our annual bazaar and bake sale. In February we put on a penny sale.

Jointly with the Hall Committee we purchased a new set of dishes for the hall.

At June meeting Mr. George Chiverton showed pictures of places and scenes in Northern Ontario. At January meeting Mr. Lyle Tait showed a film on Turkey and other middle eastern centres taken while he was a delegate at World Tobacco Congress. At the October meeting Miss Catherine McDowell of Eden spoke on her travels in Canada and United States.
