
CHURCH HISTORY

MR. & MRS. FREDERICK PELL

Saturday, June 5, 1971, was the date chosen by Yarolyn Baxter and Frederick Roger Pell as they exchanged wedding vows in the Calton Baptist Church at 4 p.m. The Rev. Hugh Stewart officiated.

Mrs. Barrie Kinsey played the selected wedding music. The bride is the daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Ttephen Roy Baxter, R. R. #1, Port Burwell and the groom is the son of Mr. & Mrs. William Pell. 5 Sunset Drive, St. Thomas. Given in marriage by her father, the bride chose a floor length gown of white Peau de Charme with eloow length bell shaped sleeves. Pearl trim accented the empire waist and the gown was enhanced by a coat train and a shoulder length veil. She carried a bouquet of yellow roses. The matron of honour was Mrs. Carl Stover of Dorchester and the bridesmaids were Mrs. Lloyd McQuiggan, Calton, sister of the bride, Mrs. Doublas MacDonald, St. Thomas and the junior bridesmaid was miss Melanie McQuiggan, neice of the bride. They were all dressed alike in floor length gowns of mauve crepe with bell shaped sleeves. The empire waistlines were accented by daisy trim and head pieces of white daisies and mauve and yellow ribbon. They carried bouquets of daisy mums and yellow rosebuds. The best man was Douglas Mac-Donald and the guests were ushered by David Pell, brother of the groom and Peter Baxter, brother of the bride. A reception for guests was held at the Sheridan Inn, St. Thomas. For travelling the bride changed to navy blue and white ensemble with white accessories and corsage. 1972

CALTON PUBLIC SCHOOL - 1964

Our school building was erected in 1951 of brick construction.

There are two class rooms, teacher's room, lobby and 2 wash rooms, also a furnace room with oil heating furnace.

Floor covering is asphalt tile laid over cement.

It is equipped with flush toilets and drinking fountain.

5 small maple trees purchased from McConnel's Nursery are growing in the school yard. 41 pupils are on the roll.

Grades include from 1 to 8.

Senior Grade teacher is Mrs. Ed Laemers, salary \$4200. per year. Junion Grade teacher Mrs. Larry Sullivan, salary \$3800. per year. The caretaker's wage \$50.00 per month.

When weather and reads permit, most of the pupils ride picycles to school.

In January, 1965, a change in the educational system took place, whereby we no longer have a local school trustee board of 3 members. Instead a board of 5 is elected from each township. Anthony Kennedy was elected from Calton.

The new national flag, the Maple Leaf now replaces the Red Ensign.

1966

School bus was purchased. Bob Kennedy - driver.

Also school bus for opportunity class in Straffordville Walter Moore - driver.

1968

We now have one school board made up of 16 members representing the whole county. The county is alvided into areas.

CALTON PUBLIC SHOOL

Western area - Alaborough, Dunwich, Southwold, Rodney, West Lorne, Futton, Port Stanley - 4 members.

Central area - Yarmouth - 2 members.

Eastern area - Malahide, South Dorchester, Bayham, Belmont, Springfield, Vienna, Port Burwell - 4 members.

Anthony Kennedy was elected from here.

St. Thomas - 4 members.

Separate School Representatives - 2 members.

1970 - Presiding teachers are: Mrs. J. Cline, and Mrs. W. Faulkner.

Pupils on the rell - 5/.

Mrs. Faulkner to catch up on her book-keeping, etc.
Mr. Cecil Noble of St. Thomas instructs the pupils once a week
in Christian education.
Music is taught once a week by mrs. Everett Mc urdy.

1971 - Anthony Kennedy was againelected to the school board. Teachers - Mrs. Joe Cline, Mrs. Barr.

No. on roll - 53

Switch of grades - 5,6,7,8, grades go to Straffordville, 1,2, 3,4, grades come from Straffordville over here daily.

47 children are on the roll.

Teachers - Mrs. J. Cline, Mrs. Barr.

School bus is driven by Mrs. Robert Kennedy.

Anthony Kennedy was again elected to the school board but owing to ill health, he resigned in March, 1973. He was replaced by Robert Howey.
