Karen & Stan Jones home was moved from the Lloyd Mcquiggan farm - 1 kilometer east of Calton to its present site in 1970. It is situated on the Jones Road which runs south from Highway 42 approximately 3 kilometers east of Copenhagen. Foundations were dug and prepared for its arrival. The family lived in it as it was until 1979 when it was gutted upstairs and down to take out walls of small rooms and make it more spacious with more closet space. They moved into the basement from January to May while renovations were being carried out. This was cosy in winter but in May they were happy to move to the renovated area, with two bedrooms upstairs with a bathroom and one bedroom downstairs with a large living room and modern kitchen.
