

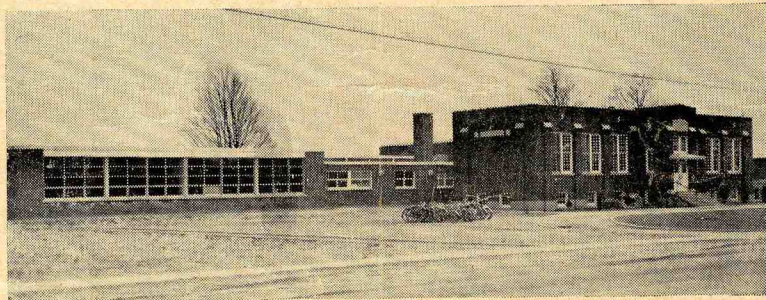
Classes Being Held At New Eden School

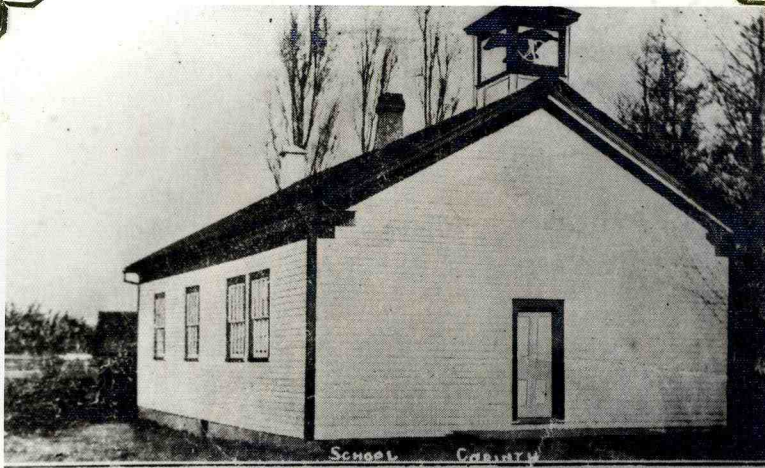
