Over the years in Canada there have been various farm political movements. The Patrons of Industry, as long ago as 1894, were active in Ontario politics and returned 14 members. The next election in 1898, there was only one Patron of Industry member left and the next election the party had disappeared.

 A great agrarian movement came to a head at the end of the First World War. The United Farmers of Ontario entered the lists in the election of 1919. It was a period of unrest; farmers were dissatisfied and there was a feeling of discontent. To their surprise, they swept the boards and carried 44 seats, and with the help of three Labor members formed a government. The late Hon. E. C. Drury, who had not even been a candidate, became premier.
