Having been closed since the Methodist, Presbyterian and Congregational Churches were joined forming the United Church of Canada in 1925, the Methodist church in Eden is very hard to research for its history, or its congregation members.

The building, however, still stands on No. 19 Highway as you enter the village from the north and is on the right. It has been converted into a Garage and service station with a livingapartment above. In 1966 it is operated by Mr. and Mrs. Harold Sawyer.

The Historical Society of Ontario has this to say about the beginning of Methodism in early Upper Canada:

"Plans are now under way for restoring (1965) an historic Methodist home on a location 35 miles west of its original site.

The house has been revered as the last abode of BARBARA HECK (1734-1804) the mother of Methodism in North America. The story is that Barbara with her husband, Paul, influenced by the preaching of John Wesley, on emigrating to New York City, brought together in 1766 the first Church-Methodist in this country. On moving to Canada as Loyalists, they settled in Augusta Township in 1785. After the death of her husband, Barbara with her son Samuel's family, moved to this house on the banks of the St. Lawrence River between Prescott and Maitland where, while reading her Bible, she passed on to her reward, Aug. 17, 1804.

Her house has been described as being one of the finest rubble stone houses of Georgian joinery. Such prominent Methodists as Nathan Bangs, Francis Ashbury, Egerton Ryerson and John Carroll have recorded visits there.

In the 1950s the Dupont Company of Canada bought the land on which it stood, carefully dismantled the house in 1963 and generously offered to transport the materials to any future reconstruction site. A non-profit company of Christian men has been formed to re-erect the house on Landon's Bay between Gananoque and the International Bridge at Ivy Lea. An architect, Mr. B. Napier Simpson of Toronto, one of the foremost authorities on the restoration of old Ontario buildings, has been commissioned to supervise the work.

The house is to become the centre of tourist interest, a retreat for small groups and part of a larger development planned to create a park land and Christian conference centre. "

The Eden Methodist Church was known as the McDowell's branch in 1854-55.

Collectors were Misses McDowell and Armstrong.



On the Same Circuit

The Maple Grove Church

David Hatch and his brother-in-law, William Bowes, are named as two of the seven trustees to whom Caleb cook gave deed of lot for the Richmond Church, March, 1850. Later the former was the moving spirit in having the first frame church at Maple Grove moved up from Straff-ordville about 1871. The building was taken down, moved and rebuilt, the new church being dedicated three years later (about 1874).

David Hatch and William Bowes were the pioneer class leaders of this Methodist church. While "Uncle William" nurtured the Church by calling upon the sick, it was always "Uncle David" who fathered it materially carrying over kindling, building the fires, in faithful free service. He even made the cedar wreaths that scalloped the walls for the annual Christmas trees.

The leading settlers supported the Church loyally with money and attendance. On their death their descendants with other in-coming residents, took over the work which then became a strong and busy congregation: Thomas Hatch and John Hatch (sons of David) and Levi Hatch Jr., before they moved away.

Edwin Bowes, Henry Hatch, Jacob Ketchabaw, John Wilson and his son William and John Stewart, William Chamberlain, Walter Mitchell, William Yeandle, James Procunier, Elgin Hatch became church pillars.

Andrew Dean taught the singing school and energetically and faithfully farthered the first then new Choir of Maple Grove Church until he moved to Eden.

Note: The North Hall Church was closed June 30, 1934. (Mrs. Cyriel Williams)
