Phase III In August, 1970 she began instruction of a Grade 6 class in a Private Community Christian School, which was then under construction having many classes in the church auditorium (Baptist). It expanded from 4 to 22 teachers in the two years.

The next year taught Language Arts and Bible Study only to Grade 5 on a Team Teaching basis. Grades 6, 7, 8 went Rotary (Incidentally they have Grade 6 Graduation exercises. Grade 7 and up is considered Junior High.) She assisted in the setting up and acquiring accreditation of the school with the Florida State.

She ended her teaching career in June 1972: Her husband employed by Sears of Tampa, Bradenton and Sarasota area. They are affiliated with the Northminster Presbyterian Church and choir, and are active in DeSoto Lakes Women's Club as well as the Suncoast Organ Club of which he is a Director, and she is a participant and Secretary in 1973-1974.

EDEN STORE

In 1865 - Solomon G. Day and Ira Day were STORE KEEPERS.

Alex Lester was the first mail carrier.

In 1869 John Nethercott was post master. Israel Stilwell - merchant

Sharp - shoemaker Rev. Robert Smith - Baptist minister Edward Smith - labourer

A news clipping in 1901 mentioned Leach Bro. having a general store in Eden. (There is a 1901 bill head of theirs on hand. (See Gray story). This clipping also mentions John Patton as a general merchant. Information gives John Patton as storekeeper in 1899.

The present store building was run by Leach Bros. in 1911, 1907, and some years prior at least as far back as 1901. In 1915 Frank Travis had the store for about a year and sold radio licences that year. In 1915 it was sold to Byron Madill and in same year it became Madill and Denton.

In Dec. 1924 Nicholas O. Stilwell bought it from Madill. (According to C.J. Ketchabaw the gas pump could have been in when N.O. bought it). All the time N.O. Stilwell had it, the post office was also there. The egg grading station was put in close to May 1, 1940, when the cold storage section was begun.

A new gas tank was put in before 1939. During the war years gas as well as many foodstuffs were severely rationed. The gas pump was removed between 1945-50 as it was too close to the road and the faster traffic.

Eden Store

C. J. Ketchabaw began working for N.O. Stilwell in 1937 and remembers the years of driving the old grocery truck. They carried enough for a whole day's trip and made a sales trip every day of the week and Saturday morning. It went as far north as Tom Sharp's at the bend of the highway north of New England corner. Went west to Highway # 3, straight across south to Corinth then way towards Tillsonburg on #3 to the 9th Concession road, north towards N. Bayham to Elliott corner off highway across the railroad track.

It went south to Maple Grove to Talbot road - 3 to 4 places on Talbot each side. Top of the hill east of Eden - didn't go down the hills. Started out at 9:30 a.m. and usually 6:00 p.m. when they returned. The same truck was used at the Mabee's Corner store. This method of selling was discontinued during the war years (1940-2?). It involved a considerable amount of trading or bartering for farm produce.

There was no hydro at Maple Grove in 1937 but it was in the Eden store in 1937. Wood furnace was the source of heat in both the church and school at Maple Grove but he doesn't remember what the lighting was.

C. J. Ketchabaw took over the store in 1950 from his father-in-law, N.O. Stilwell. He ran a very thriving business for many years selling to Cornelius Rempel in 1967. He sold to Geo. Beckett's son, who was unable to keep it open and it was closed for a short time. Gordon Murphy opened it in April 1980, and the Proprietors now are Lloyd and Jean Caughill.
