WOMEN'S INSTITUTE BRANCH BEGUN IN THE VILLAGE OF EDEN IN BAYHAM TOWNSHIP

The little hamlet of Eden, situated on No. 19 Highway, between Tillsonburg and Port Burwell, is over 100 years old, yet had never had a Branch of the Women's Institute until 1952. There were branches in villages near but it was felt that there were a large number of farm and village women in Eden and surrounding country who were not members of any branch.

A Community Club had already been organized in the village. A white brick building which had been the two-roomed Eden Public School was no longer in use since the children were being transported by bus to the Area Public School in Straffordville. This seemed an ideal place for the meetings of a branch of the W.I. Mrs. Eva Inman and Mrs. Frances Roloson called on local ladies to assess the interest in forming a branch in Eden.

On May 21, 1952, Eden Women's Institute was organized. Present to explain and assist with the organization were Miss Helen Martyn, President of East Elgin District Executive, Mrs. W.C. Wheaten, Port Stanley, District Secretary-Treasurer and Mrs. Gillett of Tillsonburg.

The meeting opened with the Ode followed by the Lord's Prayer. Miss Martyn explained the purpose of the Women's Institute. A sing-song was then enjoyed with Mrs. Ayrest Stilwell at the piano. Mrs. Wheaten then explained the duties of the secretary-treasurer and Mrs. A. Gillett of the Board of Directors of East Elgin District spoke on activities of the W.I. Mrs. W. Benner conducted the election and explained the duties of the various officers.

The officers of the Eden branch were installed by Mrs. C. Williams, London Area Representative. The meeting was then turned over to the new President, Mrs. Wiltshire, who thanked the District Officers for their assistance in organizing. It was then decided to hold the meetings on the first Friday of each month at 8 p.m.

We started in June 1952 with 18 members and in June 1954 the membership was 39. We all enjoy the meetings which have been held in the Community Centre, in the members' homes on invitation, and in the church hall, in later years. We co-operated with the Eden Community Club in many ways. We helped with their annual Garden Party, bringing pies to sell in the booth and help to serve the refreshments. We purchased dishes and silver for use in the Community Centre to be used by the Community Club as well as the W.I.

page 2 In early years the W.I. members held a Hallowe'en Party for the people of the village and especially for the children, held in the Community centre building. Other activities were collecting for the local United Appeal and also for funds for the school for Retarded children. In the fall of 1953 we held a Rummage Sale of used clothing and other articles. We had a very large assortment of good used clothing, bedding, etc., donated by the members and their friends. These were sold at very reasonable prices. This fale took place at the Community Centre and proved a very successful venture. Some heavy woolens, coats, etc., which were not sold were taken to a woollen mill later where they were made into blankets which were later sold.

A Bazaar was planned for the fall of 1954 and each month members asked to donate articles for sale, one month aprons, another month fancy work, etc. later on preserves and pickles.

Some interesting programs held in the early years included; A demonstration in a home kitchen of making Angel Cake, also recipe for home-made ice cream with caramel topping. These were later served for lunch. A local florist gave a demonstration of floral arrangements.

A nursery man gave a lecture and films on landscaping the home grounds.

A demonstration on felt craft was one evening's program.

A public Health nurse for Elgin County gave a lecture on her work. Several members and their friends gave talks, sometimes with films, on vacation trips which
