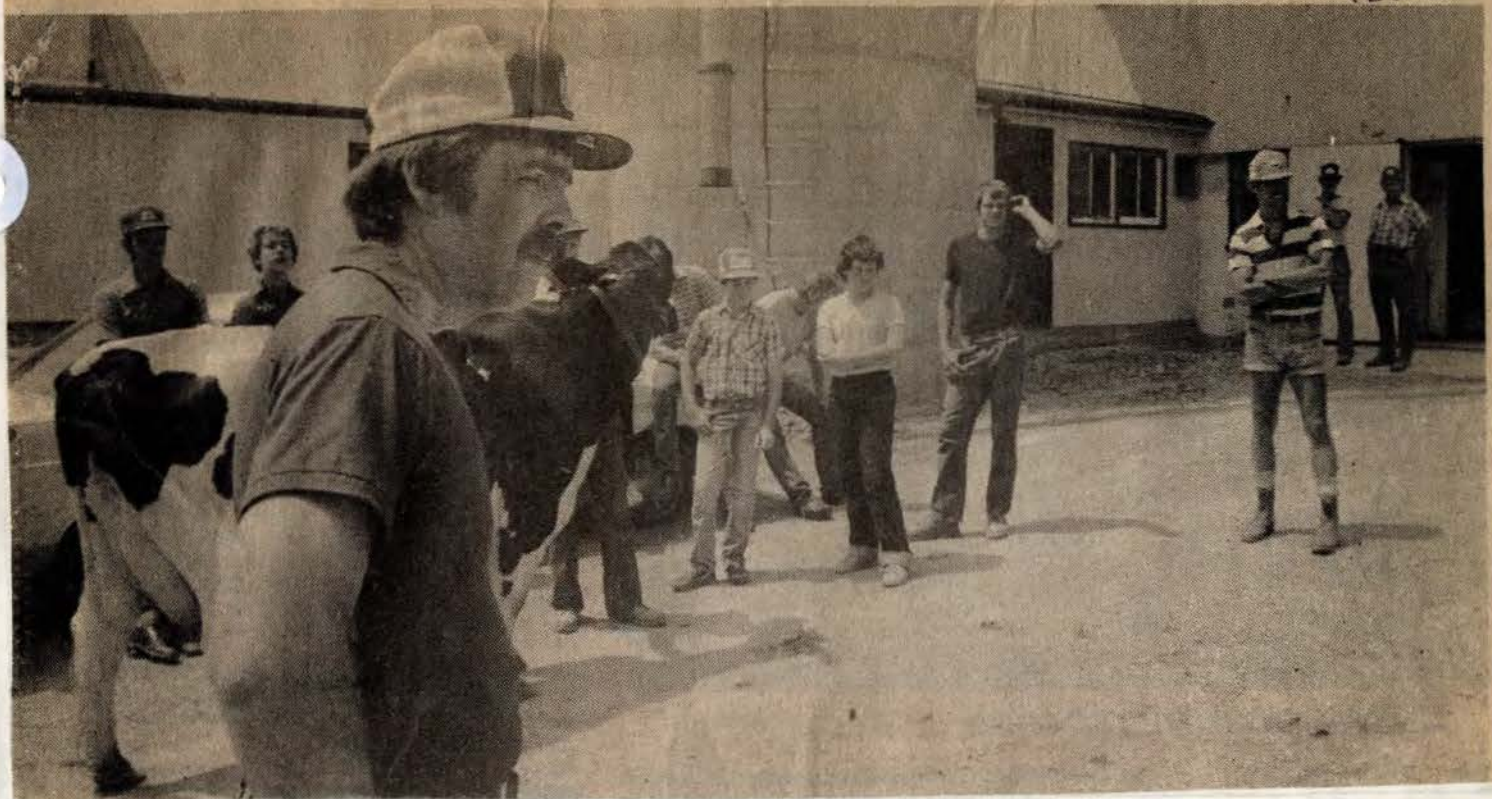




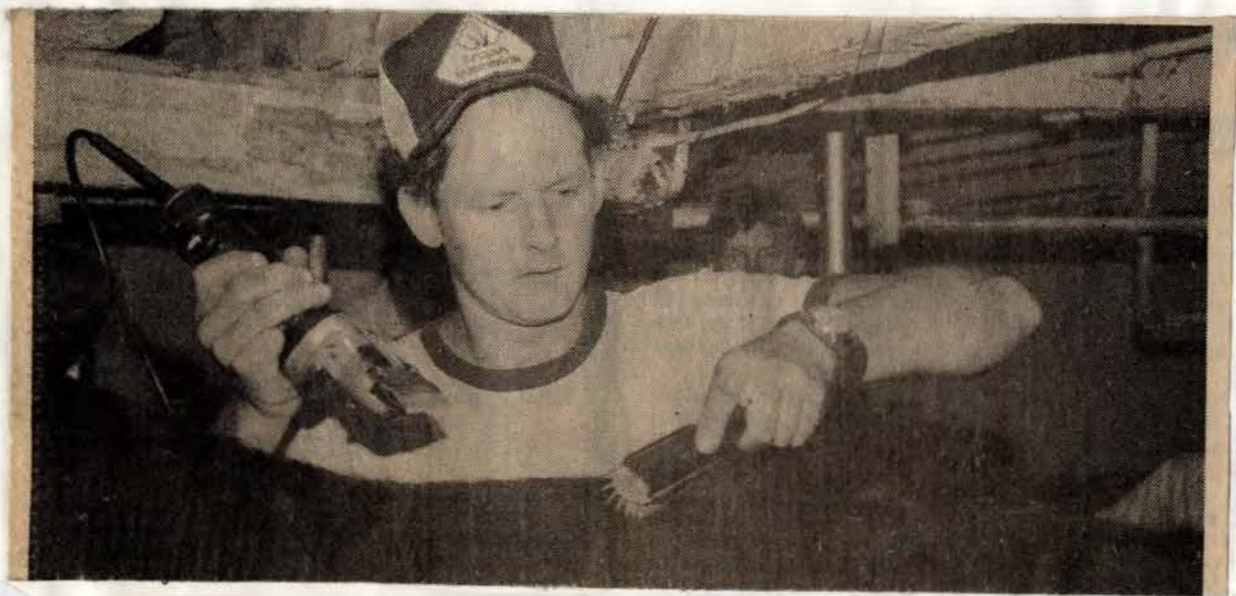

In New York they will visit Radio City Music Hall, the United Nations and will meet with the Canadian delegation and dine in the delegates dining room. They will also visit Rockefeller Centre, NBC Studios, the Empire State Building, the Merv Griffin Show, the American Museum of Natural History and a Broadway musical show.

Miss Jenkins is vice-president of the Belmont Junior Farmers. She plans to attend the London Teachers' College this fall and has completed 19 4-H homemaking and agricultural clubs.
