AYLMER HIGH SCHOOL

An August 5, 1937 Aylmer Express article reported town council voted money for the new Aylmer High School. Features of the new building included: sloping blackboards to prevent light reflecting into students' eyes, mechanical ventilation, home economics room and, a gymnasium with a hydraulic stage that was part of the floor when used for games, or raised for performances. Cost of the building would be about \$100,000. To recondition the old building would cost \$15,000 to \$20,000, and to put on the necessary addition \$45,000 to \$60,000. At the time there were 173 students in a school designed for a maximum of 125.

Mabel Legg celebrating 100th birthday Sunday

Mabel Legg of Aylmer will celebrate her 100th birthday on Sunday with an open house at New Sarum Diner from 2 to 4 p.m.

Mrs. Legg is known in the area for her youthful appearance, looking at least 20 years younger than her actual age, according to friends.

She was born in Aylmer on Tuesday, October 29, 1895, to the late Randall and Sarah Ann Learn, at the family's house on Talbot Street West. Their home stood to the west of the historic Sinclair house at 418 Talbot St. W.

Her father was a horse dealer, who both raced the animals and traded in them. Her mother was a homemaker.

Mrs. Legg said she could recall a time in her childhood when wooden blocks were used as paving on Talbot Street, and most of the town's streets were dirt roads.

After attending Aylmer Public and High Schools, she got her first job as a cashier at the long-gone downtown department store of Youell and Wrong.

She recalls working in a cashier's cage. Overhead wires with cups transported cash, cheques and bills from salespersons to her, and she sent receipts and change back.

She got into trouble her first day on the job, because she had absolutely no training to prepare her for the job.

A cup arrived at her cage

with a customer's cheque to be cashed, but she didn't know what to do with a cheque. She was nervous and refused to cash it, angering Mr. Wrong, who had authorized the transaction at the counter.

Mrs. Legg received a salary of \$4 a week for her work. "I was just a rich person" with that much money, she said.

She used her pay to buy a car with the help of her mother. She started driving when she was 16, and didn't stop, by her own decision, until she turned 95.

She worked at the department store for four years, but toward the end was increasingly frustrated by problems balancing the books.

Her accounts would be out by as much as \$8 a day, so she finally gave up and quit.

That has bothered her for decades. Only in the last month she concluded that one of the salesman had been shortchanging her.

At 21, Mrs. Legg was married to Gordon Legg, who operated a gravel truck and looked after beef cattle for farmers. They resided in South Dorchester, where they had three children, including Marjorie Robins, who died in 1969, Doretha Rolland of St. Thomas and Irene Dickhout of St. Thomas.

Mrs. Legg now has four grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

Mr. Legg died in 1974, and the following year Mrs. Legg moved to Aylmer.

She has been active over the year in Aylmer Church of Christ, Mapleton Church of Christ Disciples and Kingsmill-Mapleton Women's Institute.

She said she enjoyed residing in East Elgin, and wouldn't change any part of her life. "This is home."


