

from London I believe. This is where the little girl was killed in the yard a couple of years ago. Next on the left Norm Burwilda who works at Fords. He built first in the woods behind McBrides church. This property used to be Basil Daugherty and then McCarts where their house burned down. The house was further east past the present nail fence. Across the road a man bought but never built a house.

Next property the owners are doing a lot of landscaping. There used to be a brick & tile yard here and this brick was used to build the old Manor building. Next on the corner Farnell Nimm - who worked for the Township for years. Turn left - new house on the right the people are related to Nimm's. Next on the right Art Hutchings. Next on the left is Doug McLaughlin - son of Madeline - then Dunc McLaughlin. If we went on down this road we would come to a dead end at Harold Hutchings. I believe he is the only family on that road.

Turn right. The properties on the left hand side are all on the Oneida reserve - some nice new homes. No houses on the right hand side and we come out at the Southwood Store. At this corner there used to be 2 stores, a hotel a mill, a church & a hall. The church is a house and the hall is closed up completely after being a body shop for some years.

We turn right past Matthew McCloys on the left, Lynn Hutchings on the right. A large well on the right side of the road was a good spring capped by slave Jones when he used to draw water. Gerald Bouglion has his name on his barn on the right. Jim Perry is on the right. Mc Arthur cemetery is on the left. This cemetery has always been maintained by a local board and is named after the man who donated the property.

Turn left at the corner. On the right just before we reach the next corner is the Lloyd Larson place. He has built a new house on the base line just north of 401. There used to be a post office at the road on this property. The hollow in the lawn used to be a small gravel pit. On the left we come to SS #3 West Magdala. The first school used to be right out at the corner where the swing set sits now. In 1911 it was moved back the day after school was out in June and a second room added. It is now a home.

Turn right on the Lawrence road. The new house on the left in the woods the first one built by Buwalda, now owned by Jack McNair. This is a new house going

up, the farm has been sold but land saved  
to build a new house. McBrides church on  
the corner on the left. At one time they were  
combined with Finjal. A few years ago  
they broke away and became independent.  
Kean Bogart is in the red brick house  
on the right west corner. Next on the left  
Kear's son Allan and in the trailer his  
mother Blanche. Across the road all that  
remains of the Cranston ~~Milk~~<sup>Milk</sup> ~~factory~~<sup>factory</sup>  
Creamery ~~was~~<sup>is</sup> ~~now~~<sup>now</sup> ~~located~~<sup>located</sup> It used to be  
large with living quarters over it. Next  
to this property is the farm once owned by  
Ken Howe's father. In this front field  
a plane crashed years ago.

Haggerty's live in this area and she  
drives a school bus.

Next on the right is Harold Amitt -  
his son Steve lives in Talbotville, brother  
Tony is son-in-law of Dorothy Davy.  
Next to Harold's place is his mother Dot.  
She used to be Dot Styles from Paynes Mills  
and lived where Colmans are now.

Next door to this property stands a chimney  
stack, all that is left of a sawmill and  
cider press run by John McCormick husband  
of one your members.

The village of Lawrence Station used to have a water supply piped by gravity from a spring on the hill to the left in the woods. There was a hotel, 2 or more stores, a church now a barn and a hall that they are trying to remodel or rebuild if they can get the deed to more property. Jim Longhurst lives in the farm on the left at the west end of the village.

Next corner turn left - first house used to be Lawrence school SS#17 built in 1960 when the brick building across the road was closed with the opening of 401. Teachers at SS#3 and SS#17 at one time were Auckland sisters and sisters of Ralph & Joe and they came up on the train from St. Thomas.

At the next corner turn left past the McIntrye cemetery on the left. and the Oldham farms. On the left over the tracks is Clayton Chamberlain - a school bus driver. New small farm on the right about 15 acres.

Lynks egg farm to be seen at the left on the side road - they have bought McCandless egg station - and across the road Quality Wine Co op. Next farm on the left is Irvin Taylor - used to be Lawrence Hunter. New house on the right Vic Auckland brother of Harry. Next the old Bennett farm ~~for sale~~ of Jerry.

NEXT corner turn right on to the Oneida road. This road goes past the farm once owned by Clarence Morrow and before that by Heddy Dow. Most walked from here to SS#3.

Turn right and go to the stop sign. Turn right again. The old house on the left was once owned by Mary McIndyre who used to write a column for the Times Journal. She was Mrs. Billy Turner's mother.

Just a short distance and turn left on the Gore road again. On this corner there is a spring that Ed Dowen encased in cement and drew water from here for his threshing machine. The farm we see to the right is Dave Carroll — his wife Marilyn is one of the favorite junior teachers at Southwold School.

We continue on to Ron Pyles for tea & cookies.

We missed the Iona Station school, the Talbotville school which is now the House of Glass and the Townline school SS#19 which a year ago was owned by the Croatian Club but I'm not sure what is in there now.

We travelled these roads slowly so many times Tuesday that Janit Beharill called her neighbors — took my license

number and was going to call the OPP's if we showed up again. Fortunately I stopped her on the road for a visit and I don't think we'll have any trouble tonight.
