COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES OF NOTE.

At the beginning when the treasury needed building, this faithful group did a great deal of catering. There were turkey suppers—an annual oyster supper— chicken bar-b-que annually—Teas—Xmas Bazaar and entertainment to mention a few. Money was always needed for the upkeep of the hall—painting inside and out etc.

Over the years we also sponsored Bublic speaking contests at which time the local communitye children compeated with neighbouring groups.

We here at the Paynes Mills Hall have sponsored many of the community welfare projects—the Cancer tea, the winter picnic, the District Annual as well as assisting with housecleaning bees at the hall where all enjoyed an active part. We are always well represented at our London Area Convention and have for a number of years sponsored a card party at the hall on a regular basis during the Fall and Winter Months.

Early history of Paynes' Mills tells us that several mills and cheese factories thrived on Lot 34 N.N.B.T.R., and on Lot 35 S.N.B.T.R.

In 1903 the Paynes Mills cheese factory was built on Lot 33 N.N.B.T.R. This lot forms the western side of the road that goes northward between Lots 33 & 34. The cheese factory itself had access to this road, while the house fronted the highway (#3).

Initially built as a co-operative business, it was also privately owned by Mr. Percy Silcox during the 20's and 30's. However it returned to a farmes co-operative and ceased operation about 1943-44. Mr. Harry Eatough was the last cheesemaker. The building is still standing (1991). The cheques shown on the opposite page were part of a number discovered in a barn being demolished on Lot 32, presently owned by Randy and Debbie Dawdy, but previously owned by C.C.Minor whose signature appears on the cheques. These cheques were chosen as those receiving payment, representing some of the farmers living in Paynes Mills.
