## New sundial highlights war memorial

Southwold lost 40 men in the First World War.

There were 25 men from the township who gave their lives in the Second World War.

A committee headed by Melba Marr has uncovered the names of more than 550 township residents who signed up to fight in the great wars.

A fitting tribute to the men who gave their lives

to preserve freedom is taking shape east of the Keystone Complex in Shedden. A recent grant in the amount of \$2,100 from the provincial Main Street Ontario Millennium Fund will buy the plaques for a

permanent listing of the veterans names at the complex and at the outdoor memorial site.

A sundial, representing time immemorial, was added to the Southwold Veterans' War Memorial this week.

A veterans' war memorial committee was formed after a meeting on Tuesday at the township's municipal offices in Fingal.

Lorne Spicer of Shedden is a member of the committee headed by Southwold Coun. Stan Lidster.

Spicer said the memorial is "long overdue."

The grant is the first money from any level of government to go into the landscaping of the complex. The landscape project was originally seen as a 10-year plan. But Spicer said it may be done in as little as three years because of tremendous community support.

"We have close to \$80,000 involved right now," he said.

A donation of \$28,000 for the war memorial has allowed that work to move ahead. Funding comes from proceeds from the Rosy Rhubarb weekend and bingos.

The landscaping at the front of the complex is complete. The sidewalk continues to the east, circling the war memorial. Spicer is proud of the fact

the whole area is wheelchair accessible. It allows a mobility-impaired person in a wheelchair to go out the front door of the complex, circle through the front pergola, take the sidewalk around the war memorial and go in the complex back door.

"I'm very proud of what we have done," Spicer

Two huge stones, one from the farm of Albert Auckland, near Talbotville, and one donated by the Jenner family of Boxall, form the centerpiece of the war memorial.

Future plans, dear to the heart of Spicer, a noted tree specialist, include the planting of a nature woodlot near the memorial.


"We're planning on planting at least one of every tree native to this area," he explained. "I'm guessing there will be 50 to 60 different species."

There will be a gazebo in the woodlot. A footpath will lead from the memorial, through the trees to hook up with an established wood-chip walking trail which currently encircles the Keystone Complex property, where an old racetrack was once located.

Southwold Mayor Perry Clutterbuck said the memorial will be officially opened on Nov. 12, in an unveiling ceremony at 11 a.m.



#### Southwold Veterans' War Memorial

The site, located at Southwold Keystone Complex, Shedden will honour sixty – six residents of Southwold Township who lost their lives in World War 1 & World War 11.

In September 1998 a small group of volunteers formed a committee to landscape this beautiful facility. Len Lynch chaired this committee. The idea for a Veterans' War Memorial evolved as a key component of this project.

In October 1999 a separate committee was formed to research the names of all Southwold residents who had enlisted for active service in WW1,WW11 & Korean War. Countless hours were spent by the research committee compiling data.

The Memorial Site is a simple, dignified place of solitude. A place where members of the community and visitors can reflect on the heritage of the Township.

The Memorial Site is a circle. It is symbolic of those who "joined together" in the common cause of defending democracy and freedom.

Two great stones, one for each World War, represent "the roots of Southwold Township and the firm resolve" of these young people who left their homes, families, and community to face the uncertainty of impending conflict.

The sundial represents "remembering for all time" those from our community, who served and gave their lives for their country. The cast plaque identifies the honoured veterans who lost their lives.

In tribute to #4 Bombing & Gunnery School, that was located near Fingal, the site includes a ¼ scale silhouette of a Lysander aircraft. Over 6,000 non – pilot air crew trained November 1940 to February 1945. The Lysander was typical of the aircraft used to pull "drogues or targets" for practice by the flyers and gunners. Three of these Lysanders crashed during training flights, killing their crews.

Our intention is to produce a plaque listing the names of all who served, at the Remembrance Day Services in 2001.
