
















































BIOGRAPHY OF SARA ELLEN (SHERIN) ATKINSON MRS. MILEN ATKINSON

Mrs. Milen (Sara) Atkinson was born in Putnam, Ont. in 1891, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Sherin. She had two brothers William and Frederick, and three sisters Stella, Celia and Ethel. They came to live on what is now McDiarmid Line on a farm on which the buildings no longer exist.

She married Milen Atkinson and they had three children Wilfred, Irene and Herbert. The family lived in the house immediatley east of the Baptist Church in Shedden. Wilfred married Dora Holland from Wallacetown and they had 7 children. They lived in Duart, Ont. Irene work for a number of years at Palmer's Store. She married Hugh Telford from Southwold Station, a school teacher, and lived at Tilbury and West Lorne. When in West Lorne, Irene worked at the Post Office and later became Post Mistress. She and Hugh now live in St. Thomas. Herbie lived at home with his parents and was a casual laboror. He died in 1965.

My first acquaintance with Mrs. Atkinson was in 1950 when I began working the the Old Bank of Commerce on the corner of Union Rd. and # 3 Highway, which no longer exists. Across the corner where the Medical Building is now located, was a Service Station and Greyhound Bus Depot operated by Everett Youngblutt, a restaurant operated by Mrs. Atkinson and a welding shop operated by Wynn Lampman. Because it was unthinkable to drive home for lunch (4 miles), Margery Morrow, my Co-worker and I had lunch at the restaurant. Mrs. Atkinson was outstanding as a cook and especially as a pie-maker. Her pie crust were as thin as tissue paper and extremely delicious. She knew we were coming every day when the bank closed from 12 - 1. Our sandwich would be ready for us and as soon as a choice of pie was made, it would appear before us. I think, sandwich, pie and beverage cost .35 cents but no more than .50 cents as I remember.

Several of the local men came at noon for a full course meal. The men would include the station agent, Herbie, Everett, local bachelors, business men passing through etc.

When they were looked after, she always made time for a visit with Margery and I.

We would also be in for supper the nights we worked on Month-end or Interest figuring times - April and November. I would marvel at men stopping in for supper and perhaps ordering pork chops. We would see her go across the highway to Palmers Store and come back with the meat and cook it for the order.

Mrs. Atkinson was a true lady, with a pleasant, quiet nature. She was not a Charter member of the Shedden W.I., and I have not seen her name on a slate of officers, but she did her part as hostess, director and a participant in programs.

She was ill for some time and passed away on Thursday, July 11, 1968. She, Milen (1883 - 1961) and Herbie (1914 - 1965) are buried in Shedden Cemetery.
