He attended Aylmer High School and St. Thomas Collegiate. He enlisted in the Canadian Navy in Sept. 1943. He received naval training at H.M.C.S. Prevost, in London, Ont., and at Cornwallis, N.S. He went overseas in Dec. 1944. On V-E Day he was in board H.M.C.S. Metane, with a convoy off the coast of Norway, bound for Murmansk. At that time, fifteen German submarines surrendered to the Commander of the group of Canadian Frigates and they with the submarines, returned to Scoltand. He volunteered for service in the Pacific. At present he is on leave, visiting his mother and brother, who reside at 64 Kains St., St. Thomas, and from there will go to Vancouver, B.C.



SGT. MERRITT SIZE

Son of Mr. and Mrs. Orloff Size, of St. Thomas. He attended the Richmon Public School while living with his grandmother, Mrs. A. Size. He enlisted in November 1943, and received his military training at Florida, Louisanna, Georgia, and was in South America. Owing to illness he was honorably discharged in April 1945.



LIEUT. JAMES LAWRENCE

Son of Mrs. Laing and the late C. Lorne Laing, was born in Richmond, and attended Richmond Public School and Aylmer High School. He is a graduate Metallurgical Engineer of the University of Ann Arbor, Mich. He enlisted in the Army in 1942, while in Ottawa, where he had been for two years an airplane inspector. He received his commission as 1st Lieutat Brockville, and was given further military training at London and at Kingston. He went overseas in November 1943, and was stationed on the Isle of Wight with the 7th Cdn. Inf. Bds. W/S. R.C.E.M.E. On June 15th, he went with the Canadian Army into Normandy and served in France, Belgium, Holland and Germany. While in Germany he was in one of the large concentration camps where he saw the terrible fate of many prisoners. After V-E Day Lieut. Laing, with his unit was stationed at Wilhelmshaven in Germany. Later he was transferred to the 7th Cdn. R.E.C.C.E. Regt. and at present he is located near Utrecht, in Holland. His wife is the former Vera Crummond, of Newcastle, N.B.



FLIGHT-LIEUTENANT WILLIAM W. GODBY

Was born on the Riddell farm near Richmond, the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Clayton Godby. He attended the Richmond Public School and is a graduate of the Aylmer High School. He enlisted with the R.C.A.F. in September 1939. He received his Wings at Kingston, after which he became an instructor in the R.C.A.F. at Brantford. Later he was moved to Pendleton and commissioned as Pilot Officer, and promoted to Flying Officer. He was transferred to the Bahamas where he made round trips by plane from the Bahamas to Africa. Later he was sent to Comox, B.C., where he was promoted to the rank of Flight-Lieutenant. He has received a decoration, with the King's Commendation, which was presented by Canada's Minister of Defence for Air. At present he is instructing at No. 10 O.T.U., Comox, B.C.



STOKER BEECH I. BAKER


