In making the presentation to Mrs. Jesse Van Patter, president, at the home of Mrs. Von Brown, Mrs. Lachelin said: "We owe a great deal to Canada who founded the Women's Institutes... We are known as the mother country but we are duly grateful as a daughter institute." as a daughter institute."

"the handwork of the institute members who asked me to bring it with their love and good wishes. The legend will, we sincerely hope, remind you of us, and the flowers are the wildflowers of England."

Mrs. Lachelin was enthusiastic about the work of the institute and as past president of the English branch said she saw little difference in the aims of its members

"We really stress the rural scene." she said. "All of us take part in the usual things, handcrafts, jamming and talk about ways to improve conditions for the woman in the rural areas."

She was impressed with the fact the Bayham Institute had celebrated a fiftieth birthday. "We are only 37, she remarked.

Problems of housekeeping. "mothering," and helping a husband were the same in England as in Canada, she indicated. To prove her point she apologized to the group for not bringing along "the card I prepared with the gift. It is somewhere on the bedroom floor at home. The rush of preparing the larder for three children, a dog and packing, left me breathless and I came away with-

out it."

Mrs. Lachelin left Wednesday to Port Credit from where she and her, husband will continue their trip around the world. She explained Mr. Lachelin was a banker with the firm Philip, Hill, Higgins and Co., of London. "This is a bit of a business trip," she said. "From here we will travel west to Calgary and on to Australia, where I hope to visit another WI."
