MRS. GOWAN YOUNG RECEIVES A LIFE MEMBERSHIP

On the night of January 7th 1976 Central Yarmouth W.I. presented, with great pride, a life membership to Mrs. Gowan Young, Marguerite to her fellow members. Mrs. Vanderveen, president of this branch, presented her with the certificate and Mrs. Marshall Field, also a charter member, pinned on the badge, while her daughter, Mrs Claire Dunan as a guest joined us in our congratulations.

Mrs. Young has served all levels of the Women's Institute. Branch, District, Area, Provincial have all received her unfailing devotion and she has given freely of her time to every project. We are fortunate to have her as a member and her wise counsel is always valued.

It was in 1932 that Mrs. Young joined the Women's Institute with the South Yarmouth Branch, held the convenorship of Agriculture and Canadian Industries and served on the executive as 2nd and 1st Vice Presidents. In 1940 at the International Plowing Match, held at Ontario Hospital she served as the cashier.

From 1943 - 1947 Mrs. Young was away from the community but in 1948 returned and became a member of Central Yarmouth Branch when it was organized working her way up to be President, Standing Committee Convenor and a District Director.

For four years at Branch Level she was a 4 H Homemaker Leader and as a matter of fact along with Mrs. Angus Mc Kenzie the first of the Girls' Club named " The Milky Way ". For a year Marguerite was the leader of the Garden Club, then for three years she served as a leader of Central Elgin Junior Institute and later a leader at Senior Leadership Training School.

At the District Level Mrs. Young started off as a representative to The Federation of Agriculture for two years and five years was a member on the Elgin County Farm Safety Council attending three Provincial Conferences at Guelph besides several Zone Conferences. Added to all this she also organized Elgin East Oratorical Contests for six years. In 1953 Marguerite arranged the Elgin County W.I. members transportation to the A.C.W.W. conference in Toronto. Besides being a District Public Relations Officer, Executive Member, Vice President, President and Past President she served as Elgin County Rally President for two years.

At the Area Level Mrs. Young's offices began with Public Relations then Treasurer for six years, a Provintial Board Director, member of the nominating committee for three years and a delegate for the Area at a number of Educational Conferences. She also served as a leader at Officers' Conference as P.R.O.

At the Provintial Level Marguerite served as Board Director from 1966 - 1969 for the Sub-Division #22 - Elgin East, Elgin West and Oxford South. She spent three years on the Resolutions Committee and one year as Secretary on United Nations Committee. At Officers' Conference she was a Leader as "Member at Large" and in 1967 at Guelph was a voting delegate at F.W.I.C. Convention.

As a general member of the Women's Institute she played an important and active part on the committee which developed and set up the Elgin County Pioneer Museum in 1953 and has held the office of Secretary-Treasurer on that Board since then, a tremendous job in itself. The Museum was opened in April of 1957 enriching the life of the community and Marguerite's continued contribution to this effort has been

outstanding.

The Elgin Manor Auxiliary was also organized by Elgin County Women's Institutes and for five years Marguerite was Treasurer for that organization.

Mrs Gowan Young has been, and is, an insperation to all the members of Central Yarmouth W.I. and we are proud to have her as a Life Member.


