

FOREWORD

As men were dreaming of landing on the moon, as mechanization was replacing human labour, as the world was becoming smaller because of sophisticated communication systems and jet air travel, suddenly we realized that we must not always focus on the future, rather look back occasionally to appreciate what legacies our ancestors had given us.

With the urgings of Lady Tweedsmuir to have all rural histories recorded, Cowal Women's Institute decided, after several years discussion, that this mammoth task should be undertaken. In 1965 and 66 a great many families responded to the request to record their family history.

Then the enthusiasm died down and not too much was done until it was decided to do an update in 1983. Today only a handful of family histories are not recorded. The book has more than doubled in size and now, through the Bicentennial grant, we are publishing this history of Cowal.

Without the assistance of the members of the community this would not have been possible and we extend our appreciation for the support and dedication we have received.

There may be a few inaccuracies, but we have printed the information as received, realizing that no two accounts are repeated the same way twice.

Through the publication of this history we hope the spirit of our small Scottish community will remain for generations to come and that we will always be proud to call Cowal "home".
