Crinan Homen's Institute 1919 - 1979 (60 th Anniversary) It was during the First Horld Har, while the women of the Crinan community were doing Red Cross work that the Homen's Institute movement was first discussed. Ithen the wartine work ended, a group of enthusiastic ladies decided that a local Institute group should be formed.

The Crinan It. I was organized on april 24 th 1919 at a meeting held in argyle Presbyterian Church. As we look back over the past 60 years, we feel a deep sense of pride in the accomplishments of our organization on May 19 1919 at the home of Mrs. Neil Mc Cachien. Mrs. John C. Mc Millan was chosen as president, and the first Secretary - treasurer was Mrs. Geolge Carroll, a charter member of our Institute today. Another charter member mrs. Janes andrews also acted as a shortly after Mrs. Carroll He deeply appreciate the service these two ladies have given our organization down through they are here tonight to help us celebrate out Diamond Anniversary.
During the past 60 years, the Criman
It. I has contributed greatly to church
and community activities. The very first
money earned was spent for linen covered for the communion table, plus the purchase of a baptismal bowl and coal-oil

stove for the church, a fence was built around Simpson's cemetery, which has been repaired and repainted since its erection, Que Institute has always been most generous in its donations to many Charitable organizations. Our members have always been willing to offer their services in assisting local service citizens homes, the county museum, the cancer society, etc.

During the Second Horld Har, the It. I. was active in Red Cross work and in sending boxes to district soldiers overseas. Through the years, the It. I. has sponsored courses in sewing cooking, interior decorating etc. Ithat happy times have been shared at sewing and guilting bees! Frequently our organization has presented exhibits at local fairs.
In 1947, a Tweedsmile Book was started to record the history of the community. In 1966 Crinan's book won a prize at the District annual meeting. In 1974, the second edition of the History was begun. The are still awaiting an appointment to have the first volume microfilmed.

A highlight of each August is the annual Grandmother's meeting when these special ladies are honoured and past history is relived. Many happy social events have been enjoyed during the years. Bus trips have been sponsored on several occasions to visit many places of interest. Each year the Institute plans of Hallowe'en

Many family night gatherings have been enjoyed - also the annual summer picnic held in recent years on the grounds of our community centre. During the past few winters, Eard parties have been held on a regular basis, Just this year a 4-H group for young women has been organized under the sponsorship of our Institute. In December 1965 the It I purchased the building of U. S. S. #3, Aldborough and Dunwich, to be used as a community centre a sign was placed over the entrance. Spirit is still very much alive, as witnessed by the recent renovations to our hall. All members of the community are deeply indebted to the local to make our Community centre an important asset to our community life. So as we face the years ahead, May we remember those who lead In founding and guiding our It I -May those memories hever die!
