A little town is where it is hard for anybody to walk to work for exercise because it takes too long to stop and explain to people in cars who stop, honk and offer a ride.


A little town is where city folks say there is nothing to do, but those who live there don't have enough nights in the week to make all the meetings and social functions.

DUTTON'S FIRST TOWN HALL—This building, believed to have been constructed in the early 1890's, was Dutton's first municipal building. It stood where the present Memorial Hall is located and likely was razed just prior to the erection of the present hall in 1922. At right rear of the building may be seen the

fire hall. Across the street at the corner of Main and Mary where Al's B.P. garage now stands was J. A. Campbell's establishment. He was an undertaker here, as well as being Dutton's first Ford dealer. The photo was made available through the courtesy of Bob Moore, county engineer.






