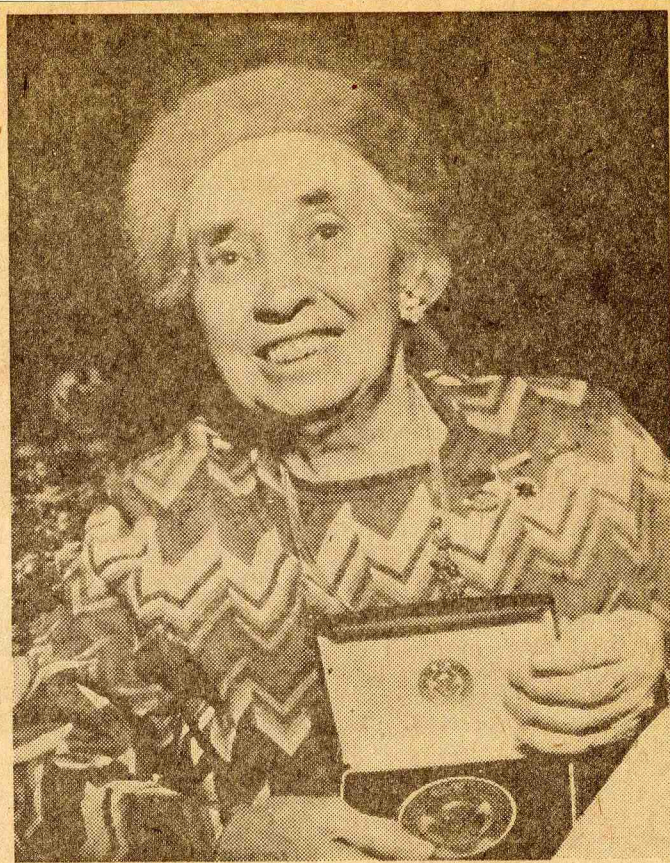

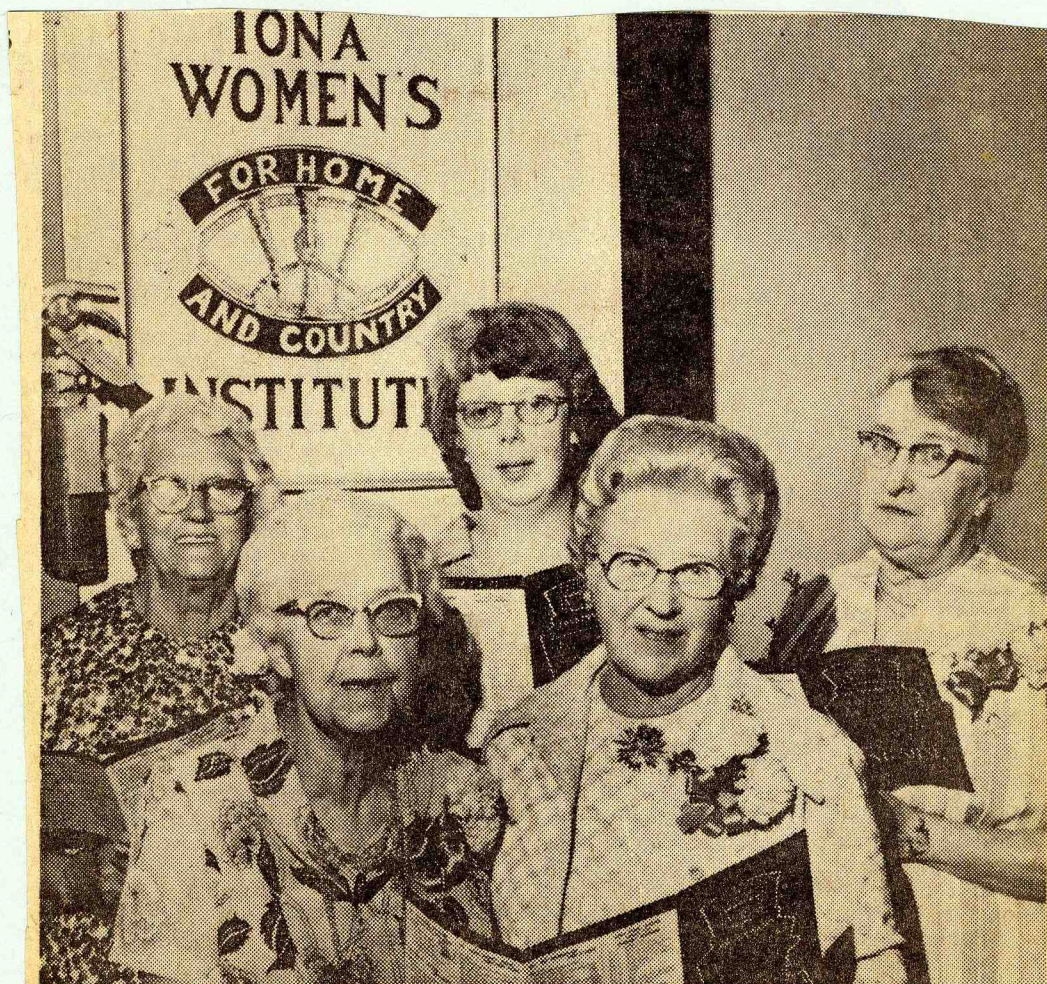

#### 50 YEARS AGO

In recognition of meritorious services rendered in 1939, during which time three lives were saved and 35 injuries treated, the Iona Highway First Aid Post was presented with a first aid hut in a ceremony. The hut was the joint gift of the St. John Ambulance Association, the Red Cross Society and the Ontario Motor League. Out of 65 such stations in Ontario, the Iona post, which is sponsored by the St. Thomas and Elgin Motor Club, was the only one so recognized.
