The Group system of working, within the Branch, adopted in 1929, was discontinued in 1961 and a Ways and Means Committee, named each year, is appointed to act for the Branch as one unit. Many interesting and enjoyable occasions have been undertaken to increase the funds as a result.

On August 29th, 1962 a chicken barbeque was held at the Disciple Church, Mapleton, the meal being served in the church dining hall. Mr. Hall of Aylmer was responsible for the delicious barbequed chicken. The Institute women provided potato salad, cold slaw, rolls, pie and coffee. Adult tickets were \$1.25 and children 75¢. The net returns were \$125.97.

On June 14th, 1963, a Rose Tea and Food Sale in the Lyons Hall with guests from other Branches, was an enjoyable event and netted the sum of \$65.61.

On July 4th, 1964, Members, children and two of our men(45 in number) motored to London to be guests on the C.F.P.L. 'Act Fast' Television Show. The program was taped and was given the next evening on the regular 6.30 P.M. program. At the close of this performance, Mrs. R.Lunn, President of the Branch was presented with a cheque for \$ 90.00, the winnings of the pannel of the program.

In 1951, the open air Sunday service was discontinued. Since 1930, this inspirational Service had been held annually in a time when Community gatherings had meant a great deal.

In the early year, the membership annual fee was 25¢. Then it was raised to 50¢. In April 1964, it was increased again to \$1.00.

During the early years (1907 - 1957) each president served for a one year term. Since 1957, the term has been for two years.

On October 2nd, 1962, under the 'Save The Children plan, the Kingsmill - Mapleton Branch, assisted by an annonymous donor, undertook the spansership of a needy child for one year. Jacob Zerbah, a 12 year old African child was assigned to us. At the end of the year, due to complications surrounding the boy, this adoption was cancelled at the end of his year and another child - Shui Chunng, Castle Peak, New Territories, Hong Kong, a child of $6\frac{1}{2}$ years, was recommended by the Field Worker as being deserving of assistance and was accepted for adoption for one year. The cost to the Institute being \$ 60.00 a year.

Some of the other projects have been - Assistance to the Child Health Clinic in Aylmer. Penmies for Friendship' (A world wide Institute project), Gifts at Christmas to patients at the Ontario Hospital, St. Thomas, Gifts of money to the Elgin County Museum, St. Thomas, Gifts of jams and jellies to the Memorial Hospital, St. Thomas, Gifts to the Memorial Sick Children's Hospital Tondon and to the School for Retarded Children, St. Thomas.


