

SCHOOL SECTION NO.24 SOUTHWOLD AND NO. 25 YARMOUTH.

The School known as No. 24 Southwold and No. 25 Yarmouth was situated on the Town Line between Yarmouth and Southwold (later called the Wellington Road) about two miles north-west of St. Thomas.

The land comprising 625/1000 of an acre was purchased from Samuel Freeman for \$110.00 and the frame school was built in 1874. It served the community for forty-nine years and then, when St. George St. and Lynhurst were built up more and so many scholars came from that district, it was thought advisable to build a school further south. So one and one-half acres of land were purchased from Henry Pressey for \$800.00 and a modern two room red brick school was built in 1923.

On December 28, 1923, the old school and land were sold by public auction to the highest bidder, Mr. E. McCaulley of Malahide for \$488.75.

The following year September 6, 1924, Mr. McCaulley sold it to Mr. A.D. and C.C. Askew for \$625.00. They kept bees there for two years and, on November 2, 1926, they sold the land to Henry Freeman, son of the former owner for \$225.00 and the school building to Wesley Trigger for \$225.00. Mr. Trigger removed the building to his farm and is using it for an implement shed. Mr. Freeman cut the trees down and removed the fence, so to-day nothing remains there of the old frame school house but a memory.

In the early days the older boys took turns in looking after the fires, sweeping floors etc. Later they were paid ten cents a day in the winter and five cents a day in the summer. In 1906 the total expenditure for the school was \$338.46. This included teacher's salary \$225.00, Janitor fees \$20.00, 6 cords of wood at \$2.25 a cord, insurance \$2.00, cleaning well \$1.50, cleaning school twice at \$3.00, cleaning of clock 75¢, two brooms 25¢ each. Twenty years later in 1926, the total expenditure for the same school section, though a new school, was \$2,684.25. This included two teachers' salaries. Another twenty years, 1946, the total expenses were over \$4,000.00.

YARMOUTH RED CROSS SOCIETY

On Monday, October 30, 1939, at 8 p.m., a meeting was held in the Township Hall at Yarmouth Centre to consider the forming of a branch of the Ontario Division of the Canadian Red Cross Society. Norman Martin was appointed chairman and Mrs. Clarence Gloin, secretary. It was decided to form a branch and a nominating committee, N.R.Martin, W.E.Locke, H.L.Lawton, Roy Tansley and Mrs. Ralph Heydon, were appointed.

On Monday, November 6, the following officers were

The following committees: Campaign, to arrange a general canvass for funds, and Advisory, consisting of one woman from each of the 12 polling-divisions, were set up and it was decided to use part of the Township Hall as a work-room.

On November 12, at a meeting of the Executive and Advisory Committee the following committees were set up: Purchasing, Sewing, Knitting, Supply, Transportation, Hall, Publicity and Finance.

In January, 1940, Norman Martin became President and continued as such until January 31, 1947. Mrs. Blanche Curtis became War-work Convenor (continued until January 1,1943). Mrs. Cyril Williams became Secretary (continued until January 1947). Miss Catherine McIntyre became Supply room Convenor (continued until January,1947). Mr. Harvey Lawton became Treasurer and continued as such until January, 1947 when the branch was dis-banded.

Various methods of raising money were employed: general canvass by polling divisions; 2 garden parties at Mr. and Mrs. Morrison McLaws; salvage collections; food sales (weekly in Gould's Drygoods store for several months); teas; autograph quilt (Mrs. Fred Hill convenor); dances; raffles; sales of goods donated by people of the community; and donations from other organized societies.

On instructions from Toronto, 25 hospital units were set up to be used as an emergency reserve. At the close of the war these had not been used and were divided equally among the four branches of the Women's Institutes of Ontario, situated in the Township of Yarmouth. Added to these were sufficient articles to complete a loan cupboard for the use of any needy persons in our township. These cupboards are

the property of the Women's Institutes.

On January 18,1947, a donation of \$3,000.00 was made to the Memorial Hospital Extension Fund, a cheque being presented to C.W.Kemp, Treasurer of the Hospital Extension Fund by the Society Treasurer, Harvey Lawton. This donation is to endow a private room in the proposed new hospital in memory and to homor the girls and boys from Yarmouth Township who served in World War II. A committee with W.M. Anderson as convenor was set up to secure the names and addresses of these girls and boys.

At the annual meeting January 31, 1947, it was reported by Miss Catherine McIntyre that the total number of articles completed during the war years was 37,363. The auditors reported the total amount of money raised was \$37,016.13.

On January 31,1947, the Secretary was instructed to notify the Secretary of the Ontario Division of the Canadian Red Cross that the Yarmouth branch was disbanding.
