



HISTORICAL SKETCHES OF

SOUTHWOLD TOWNSHIP SCHOOL SECTIONS



Reminiscence was the order of things on Sunday afternoon, June 15, 1969, when pupils and former pupils of s.S.#7 Southwold, (Paynes Mills) gathered for a final reunion before the school's closing. In September, 1969, the pupils will attend Southwold Central School # 1 on Talbot Road West.

Rain and cold grey skies did little to dampen the enthusiasm and enjoyment of the 275 who attended and the Women's Institute Hall provided shelter from the elements for the event which originally had been scheduled for the school grounds.

The school itself was a popular meeting place, and focus of attention were the displays which had been assembled and set up by the pupils and their teacher, Mrs. Jack Satchell.

Old desks, slates, and old books depicted a school room of long ago, which even included an apple for the teacher, while more modern equipment and teaching aids were set up on the opposite side. Photographs of school gatherings and an exhibit of entrance certificates attracted many, seeking to identify themselves and friends.

The pupils from the school sang several selections, and an accordion solo was played by Gary Latimer.

A history of the school, which was available to the guests, has been compiled and written by Mrs. Thomas Blackman, and Mrs. Blackman gave a resume of the contents of the booklet.

Eleven former teachers were present, all of whom spoke briefly regarding their teaching days at SS#7.

Ten families of Payne's Mills community were in charge of arrangements for the memorable occasion, and Albert Auckland acted as chairman for the afternoon.
