Enlisted March 1916 with 91st Battalion in St. Thomas at age of 19. Sailed to England June 25, 1916. Was transferred to 38th Battalion. Sent to France August 1916. Services in Belgium, Somme, Vimy Ridge, Passendale. Wounded October 31, 1917. Hospitalized, transferred to hospital in England in December 1917. Returned to Canada in October 1918. Hospitalized in London and Toronto until Honorable discharge in February 1920. Not fit for military services.

Enlisted in 1915 with 91st Battalion in
St. Thomas. Sailed overseas on June 25, 1916.
Transferred to 38th Battalion.
Killed in action in 1917.

Sergeant Berdan joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in May 1940, serving in Canada for three years and in England for two and one half years, returning to Canada in July of 1945. He volunteered for duty in the Pacific theatre of war but hostilities ceased before he left Canada. He received his honorable discharge in September 1945

Cpl. Archie Malcolm---1940



Corporal Malcolm joined the Elgin Reinforcements June 15, 1940. Thence to Chatham basic training centre Sept 16, 1940. Provost duty Sept. to Nov. 1941. Then to instructor of small arms, first aid gas, and drill.

On September ? sailed for England 1943. Served in United Kingdom only, three months infantry; one year railroad Engineers, nine months 22nd Canadian General hospital, returning home Sept. 12, 1945.

He received his honorable discharge October 25, 1945 after serving five years and 39 days on active service.
