

The federal government's privacy legislation, known as the *Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act* (PIPEDA), comes into effect on January 1, 2004. The purpose of the legislation is to establish rules to govern the collection, use and disclosure of personal information in a manner that recognizes the right of privacy of individuals with respect to their personal information and the need of organizations to collect, use or disclose personal information for purposes that a reasonable person would consider appropriate in the circumstances. Since we collect donor information at the door, via the tax receipts, this legislation applies to the Heart Month campaign.

This February, when you're at the door, please direct all privacy-related questions from donors to our Chief Privacy Officer at 1-888-HSF-INFO (473-4636).

The Chief Privacy Officer will be able to answer any questions that the donor may have regarding privacy legislation, as well as ensure them that the Heart and Stroke Foundation is committed to protecting their privacy-related concerns.

Also for your reference, the Heart and Stroke Foundation's privacy assurance is as follows:

We are committed to protecting the privacy of your personal information. We may maintain a record of your interaction for donor-related, promotion and tax receipting purposes, where required.
