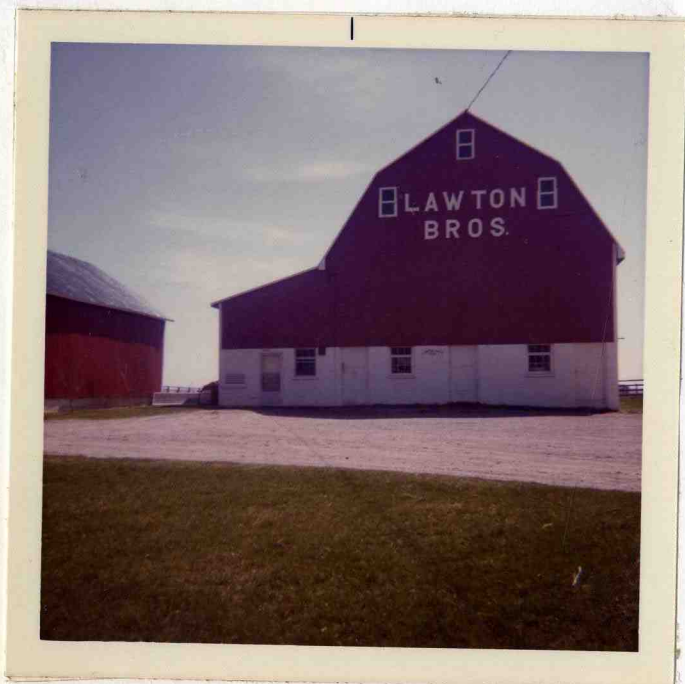

On Oct. 30, 1970. Leina and Norm McCallum had been Post Master and Post Mistress for 25, years.

Two pins was presented to Norm. April 27, 1973, One for 25 years of service in the Post Office and the other for public service.

At the bottom of the picture of Leina and Norm is shown the two pins.

In the picture of the building the middle door is the Post Office and the door on your right is the store operated by Fred and Mary Hindley from 1964 - 1974.

Fred and Vera Heidt Took over store Sept 1975 left June 1st 1977. Mr & Mrs Ken Brown took over. Mrs ^{MARY} Morrison was Post Mistress until Nov. 1982 - PRESENT NADINE BECKETT.

In the 1800 the house was on the north west corner off ^{John} John St. and Colbourne St. used for home of the Sweedland family.

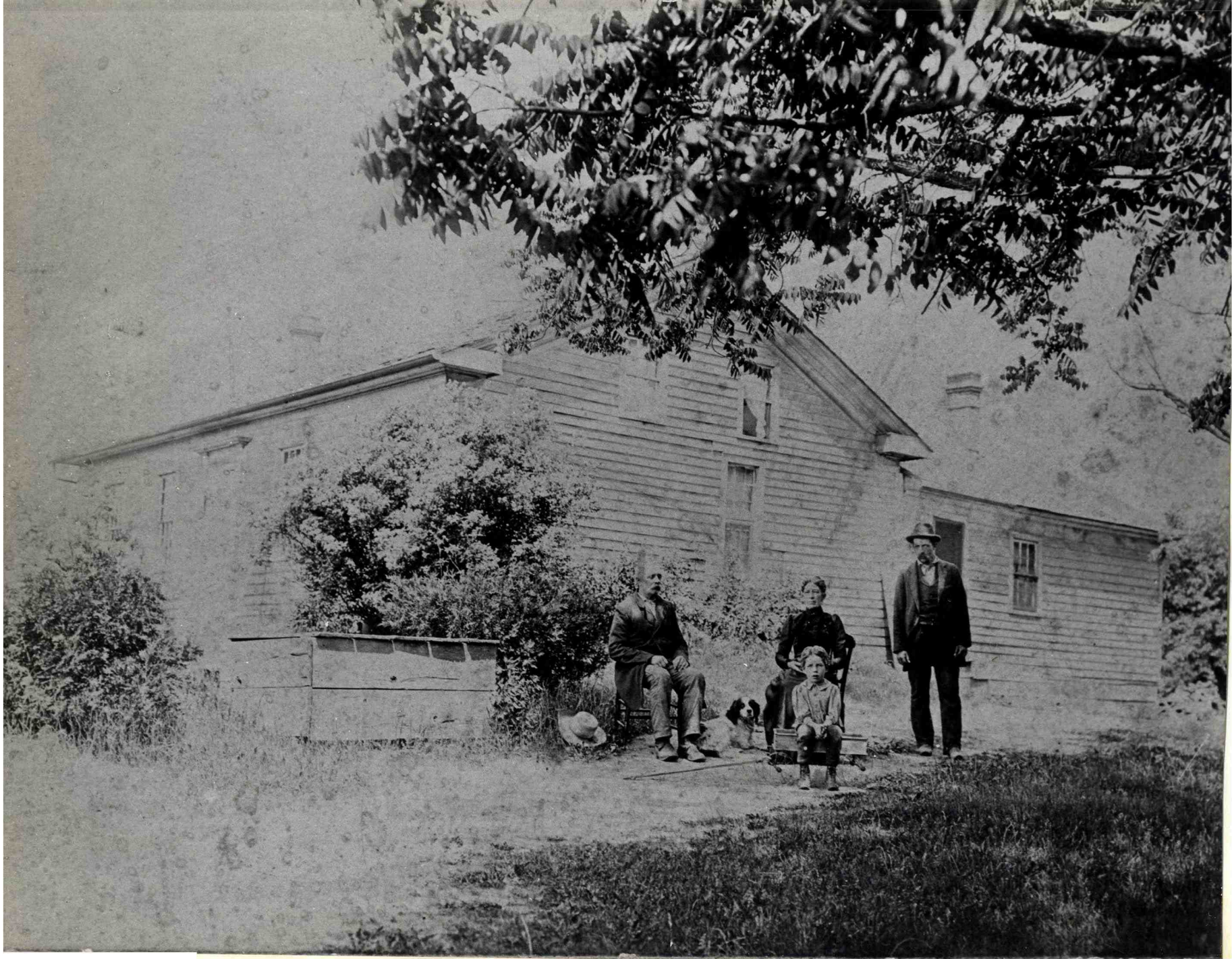
