When the 91st Battalion Marched Off to War



IF YOU ARE FORTY YEARS OR SO OF AGE you may remember this scene. It was taken by Scott the photographer on June 26, 1916, the Sunday afternoon the 91st Battalion (Elgin's Own) marched from their barracks in the old Thomas Brothers factory off Chester street to the M.C.R. station to start on the first leg of their trip overseas during World War I. The picture was taken at the corner of White and Talbot streets.

Elgin's Own at Dinner and Church Parade

One to Be Held Friday Even-
ing and Other on Sunday
Morning to Trinity

The 91st Battalion Association is "all set" for the Annual Reunion to be held in St. Thomas during the coming week-end.

The reunion starts Friday evening with a dinner in the Legion Hall which will be attended by the veterans of this gallant battalion of the First World War and by their wives and sweethearts. Many who now live outside the city have signified their intention of being present. Others whose addresses could not be learned will no doubt see this news item in The Times-

Journal and will attend. Lt.-Col. W. J. Green who raised and took "Elgin's Own" overseas nearly 35 years ago will be the toastmaster. The Legion Ladies' Auxiliary will serve the dinner. Entertainment, furnished by a local organization of New Canadians, and dancing to the music of Hal Stuart's orchestra will follow.

Sunday morning the veterans, along with the recently-organized Elgin branch of the R.C.A.F. veterans and members of the Canadian Legion will parade from the Legion Hall in John Street to Trinity Church where the Battalion Colors are deposited. The parade will be headed by the Elgin Regiment Trumpet Band and the Legion Brass Band. Rev. (Honorary Captain) R. W. Lane, chaplain of the Legion branch here, and who was a chaplain with the Army in World War II, will be the speaker. Rev. Mr. Lane is rector of St. John's Anglican Church.

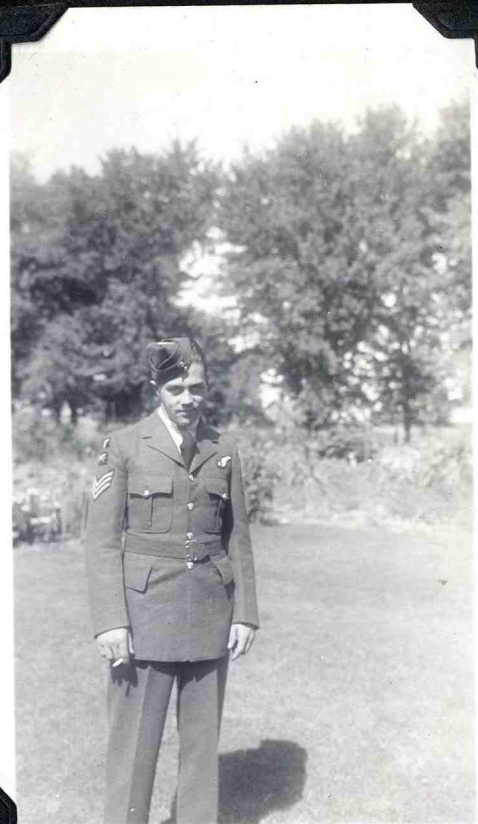
