





A giant tree planted by Colonel Talbot as alandmark for sailors.

Tribute Paid Colonel Talbot



In near-zero weather 126 years ago, a group of distinguished early colonists and builders buried Colonel Thomas Talbot in historic St. Peter's Cemetery at Tyrconnell. Colonel Talbot brought out more than 200,000 settlers to Western Ontario, laid out roads and completed the first survey of this part

of Upper Canada. Deputy-Reeve Garnet Speers, of Port Stanley, right, on behalf of Elgin County council, and John E. Pearce, on behalf of St. Peter's Anglican Church, placed a wreath on the crypt that overlooks Lake Erie.
