

Lions Clubs International History

The International Association of Lions Clubs began as the dream of Chicago businessman Melvin Jones. He believed that local business clubs should expand their horizons from purely professional concerns to the betterment of their communities and the world at large.

An organizational meeting was held on June 7, 1917 in Chicago, Illinois, USA. A national convention was held in Dallas, Texas, USA in October of that year. Just three years after

its formation, the association became international when the first club in Canada was established in 1920 in Windsor.

In 1925, Helen Keller challenged Lions to become "Knights of the Blind". Lions Clubs International has grown to include 1.3 million men and women in approximately 45,000 clubs located in 200 countries and geographic areas.

Club History

The Dutton & District Lions Club was chartered on January 14, 1967 as the West Elgin Lions Club. Our sponsoring Club was St. Thomas Lions Club.

We became quite active almost immediately after being chartered. In the early years dances were held to raise money Christmas Frolic, Valentine Dances, Video Dances and of course New Year's Eve Dances. Raffles were held for such things as a \$50.00 bond, a suit, a colour TV, a Stereo and now we have the Elimination Draw. Along with the raffles came the beginning of Bingos. including Turkey Bingos each year. Now we go further afield to St. Thomas to work bingos.

Being an active organization much has been done in the community over the years. One of our first community service activities, September 1967, was to install numbers on all the homes in Dutton. We also in the early years built cupboards in the food booth area of the West Lorne Arena. Playground equipment was installed in the Sons of Scotland Park.

In 1969 we supported the Swimming Pool construction. In 1977 we donated to the construction of the Community Centre and provided 250 chairs and 30 tables. In 1979 we built the picnic shelter in the Sons of Scotland Park. In 1986 we pledged funds to the new Library and a commitment to St. Thomas-Elgin General Hospital Expansion. In 1991 a photocopier was placed in the Library.

Our most ambitious project was the building of Caledonia Gardens. Now we are ready to start Caledonia Two this summer.

Our old food trailer was replaced a few years ago and now we serve food in more locations such as Patterson Steam Show, Wallacetown Fair, Rosy Rhubarb Days.

Our Club has also produced a number of District Officers over the years and has sponsored two Lions Clubs (Rodney & Highgate) and our very busy local Leo Club.



What We Support

We support many things locally - such as minor sports, our local swimming pool, affordable housing for seniors, the medical centre, Elgin St. Thomas General Hospital, Daffodil Society Welfare Branch, local Library, to name a few. We, as Lions also support many other Canadian and International projects like those listed below:



Lake Joseph Centre (pictured at left). The CNIB Lake Joseph Centre was the result of a camping program initiated by CNIB in collaboration with the members of the Lions Family of Ontario. In October of 1960 the Lions, CNIB and the Canadian Council for the Blind found a small piece of paradise on Lake Jo in Muskoka. Many Lions Clubs across Ontario and Quebec support this camp for the Blind, including Dutton & District.

Lions Camp Dorset a resort for people on kidney dialysis. The resort has a dialysis unit onsite in order to provide guests in renal failure with their dialysis three times a week. It also provides an excellent opportunity to experience the great outdoors; get back to nature; and enjoy a relaxing atmosphere away from the stresses of everyday life. Once again many Lions Clubs, including our own, support this worthy camp.





Lions Foundation Canada This is our Canadian Lions dog school where dogs are raised and trained in three different programs: Seeing Eye Dogs; Hearing Ear Dogs; and Special Skills Dogs. Every time our club gives a Lion of the Year award or a Judge Brian Stevenson award we are donating to this program. Since 1983, the lives of over 1200 men, women and children from the age of 8 to 84, have been enriched by the services of specially trained Dog Guides from Lions Foundation of Canada.

Lions Homes for the Deaf We support our Lions homes for deaf people every time we give a Helen Keller award.





Lions Club Camp Kirk is located at Kirkfield, Ontario, on Highway 48 immediately east of the village. It was built and paid for by the Lions and Lioness Clubs of District A-16 between the years 1990 and June 1993 but many other clubs have since made donations. It is a residential summer camp for boys and girls who suffer with learning disabilities

There are many other International Programs that we support from time to time including Quest, Eyes Right Foundation, Collecting used eyeglasses, Lions Club International Fund, and disaster relief both locally and abroad.







Laura and Winston reside in Barrow where they are employed at Hopson Middle School.


