Adelaide Hunter Hoodless

BORN FEB. 27th, 1859 - died FEB. 26th, 1910.

An oil portrait, painted by J.W.L. Forster, the gift of the Women's Institutes of Ontario, hangs in the reception room at Macdonald-Institute. A bronze-tablet in her memory was presented by the former students of Ontario Normal School of Domestic Science.

In 1937 a memorial cairn was erected at St. George by the Women's Institutes of Brant County.

On May 8th 1950, an oil portrait was unveiled at Ottawa, and placed in National Archives, it was second portrait of a Canadian-woman to be accorded this honor.

The memory of Mrs. Hoodless will ever be held dear to Women's Institutes, especially in Canada.
