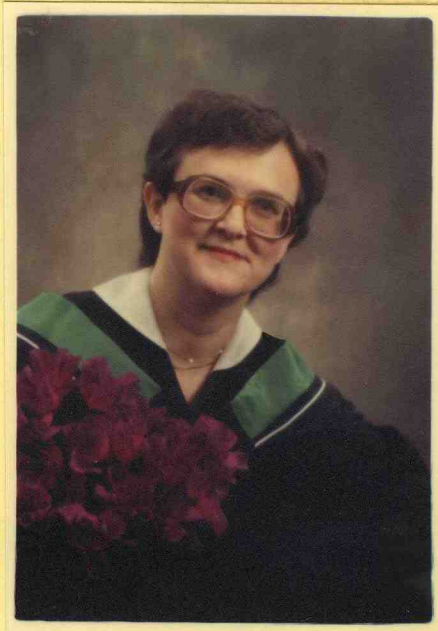

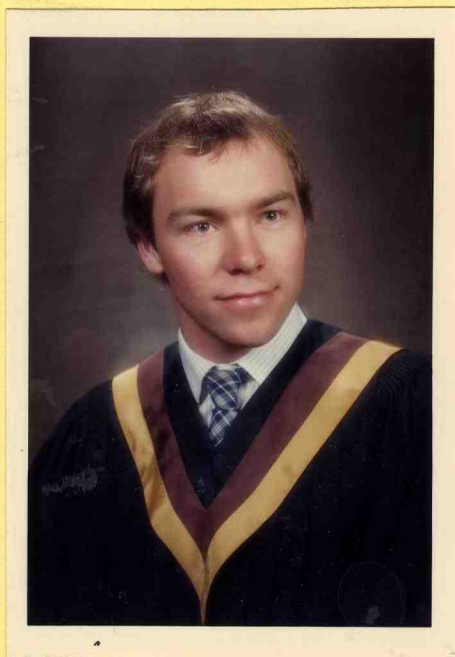

She has been employed at Victoria Hospital in London, Ont., since 1981.

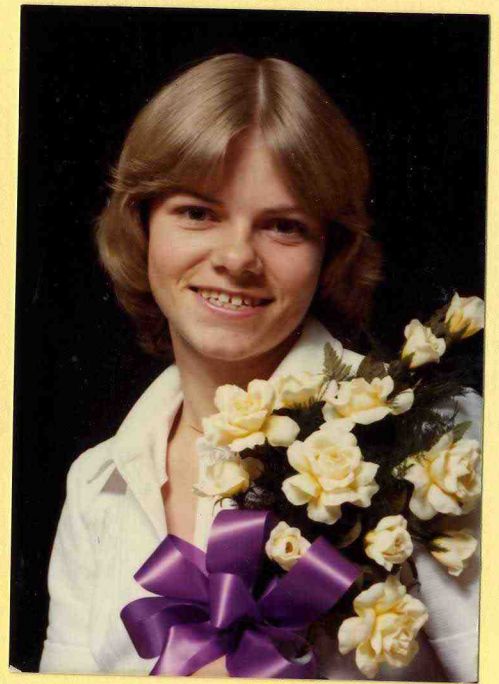
Mary was married, April 27th, 1985 to Michael Bowering of Melbourne and they reside in Mt. Brydges.

ED. is the son of Joe and Jean Van Nuland.

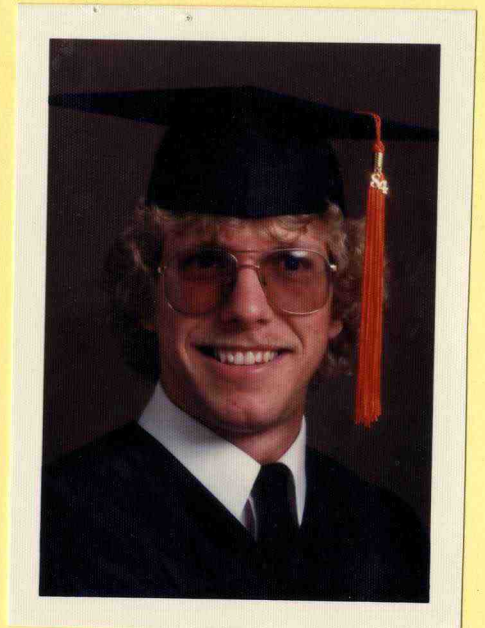
He graduated on June 14, 1984 from General Motors Institute in Flint, Michigan, having successfully completed his Bachelor of Mechanical Engineering Degree.

Anita was also the recipient of the 60th Anniversary Scholarship, presented by the Federated Women's Institutes of Ontario. Anita, aged 19 years is in her first year at the University of Guelph where she is enrolled in the Bachelor of Agricultural Science program. She has been a 4H member for seven years and has completed 18 clubs.

Anita is the eldest daughter of Krin and Connie Dieleman of R. R. 1, Wallacetown and a graduate of West Elgin District Secondary School.

Schools in S. S. #14, Dunwich

The earliest school was on the tenth concession down in the hills.

In 1910 two new schools were built in Section number 14. No. 14 North- on 10th concession and on Lake Road near Port Talbot 14 South.

The 14 North one was built on a half acre, $\frac{1}{4}$ acre was off the Jones Farm and the $\frac{1}{4}$ acre off Thos. Breen's farm. Both schools were of cement block with a pink trim and full basements. Mr. Rolson did the cement work for both schools for \$ 850. Mr. Sam Stidwell was the carpenter doing it for \$ 1040.00 for both.

Miss Kate McQuire was the first teacher in 1910 in 14N; Miss Mabel Whitelock in 1911; A.B. Carless in 1912; Miss Liliias Taylor 1913 (\$ 525.00); Miss May Breen 1914 - stayed for six years; Miss Hazel Breen taught at 14S in 1917; Other teachers were Miss Dorothy McGaw; Miss Ruth Webb; Miss Nellie Auckland; Miss Evelyn Haggerty; Miss Sarah Bruce; Miss Myrtle Bobier; Miss Elizabeth Spry; Miss Marion McLennan; Miss Frederica Beecroft; Mrs. Clarence Taylor.

On June 28, 1946, North Dunwich school closed due to insufficient enrolment. Mac Gordon was hired to transport the children to the south school at a salary of \$ 600.00. Mrs. Margaret Austin was the teacher @ \$ 1350.00 for three years 1946-49. Will Lunn was hired to drive the children in 1947. Miss Catherine Coulter was the teacher from 1949-52 for \$ 1900.00 Mrs. Cecil Campbell taught from 1952-54; Miss Margaret Breen 1954-58; Miss Joan Barfett 1958-60; Mrs. Nina McIntyre 1960-66.

Mr. Chas. Barfett and Mrs. Paul Pedersen were drivers for the children, after Will Lunn.

In Jan. 1, 1965 several schools in Dunwich joined the school area, with one group of trustees looking after the schools. Some were bused to Dutton-Dunwich Public School. An addition was completed to this school and in Sept. 1, 1966 all pupils were transported to Dutton. This marked the closing of S. S. #14 S and all other schools in Dunwich.
