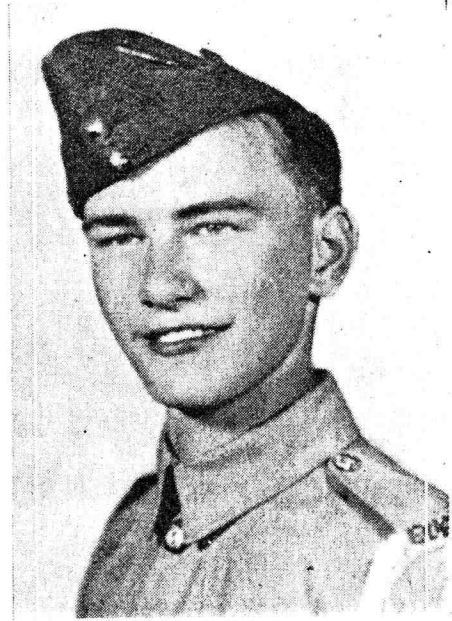




**RAYMOND H. ADLINGTON**

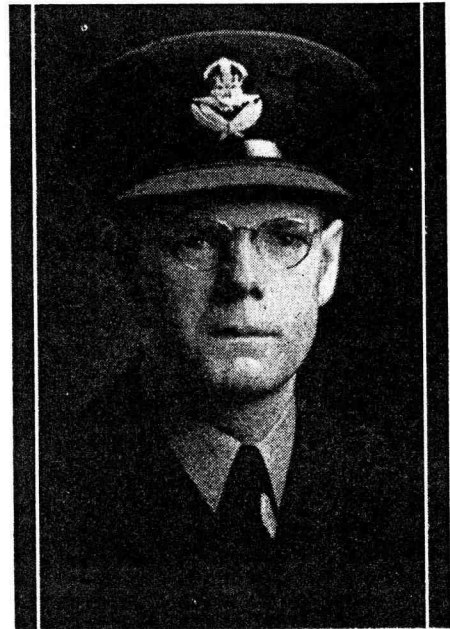


RAYMOND ADLINGTON

**B**ORN on February 22nd, 1922. He enlisted on November 26th, 1941, for active service with the Canadian Armoured Corps, at London, Ont., and served at London, Kitchener and Camp Borden, going to the United Kingdom in May, 1942. He transferred to 1st Hussars in June, 1943, and went with them to France on D-Day. His tank was knocked out and he was reported missing, but was later picked up wounded, and went to the hospital for two months. After release from the hospital he went to the Armoured Carrier Regiment in France, later to Belgium, Holland and Germany. At the end of hostilities he joined the Army of Occupation Forces, and is at the present time in Germany.

He later enlisted for active service on December 21st, 1942, and took his basic training in Chatham and later at Petawawa as a member of the Royal Canadian Engineers. He left for the United Kingdom on August 3rd, 1944, on the Empress of Scotland, and went to France on September 24th, 1944, and on to Belgium. Due to sickness he was in hospital in England for two months, then returned to Canada on the first trip of the Letitia as a hospital ship in December, 1944. He received his discharge on February 10th, 1945.

### GEORGE RUSSEL GILBERT

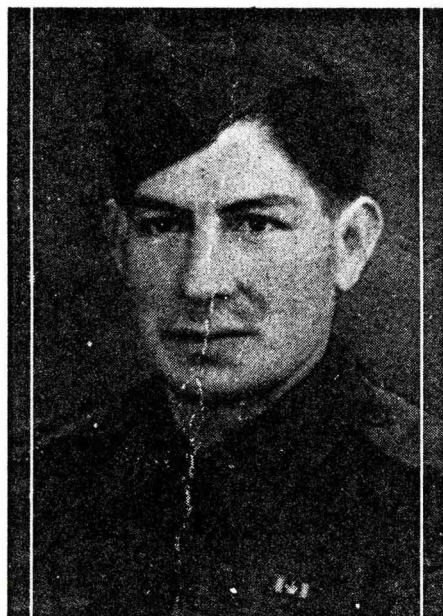
CPL. — A4231

In September, 1944, he went to Belgium, and in November to Holland, and then on to Germany in March, 1945, where he remained till May, 1945. He came back to Holland, returning to the United Kingdom August 3rd, 1945, and then to Canada on the New Amsterdam, September 9th, 1945. He was discharged October 29th, 1945.

On completion of his training in Canada he went overseas in December, 1941, and was posted to 206 Squadron of Coastal Command stationed at Aldergrove in Northern Ireland, later moving with that squadron to Benbecula, Outer Hebrides. In March, 1943, he was posted as a Corporal to 330 Norwegian Squadron at Oban on the west coast of Scotland. After being commissioned in April, 1944, he rejoined 330 Squadron at Sulum Voe in the Shetlands, later being posted to 86 Squadron at Tain on the Moray Firth, Scotland. F/O Griffiths returned to Canada in February, 1945, and after serving at Clinton and at Brig Harbour, Labrador, he was discharged on September 20th, 1945, and is now studying electronics at the University of Western Ontario.
