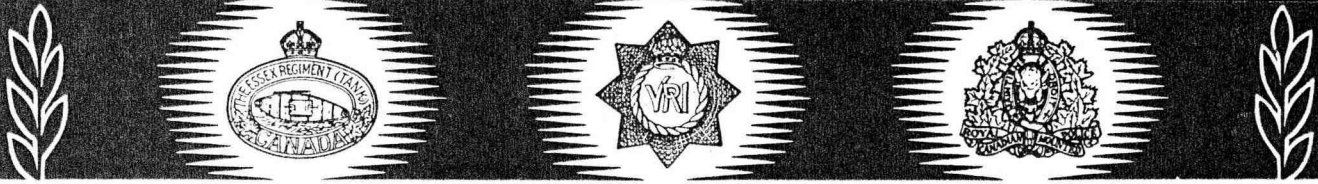
NORMAN CHARLES LAMB

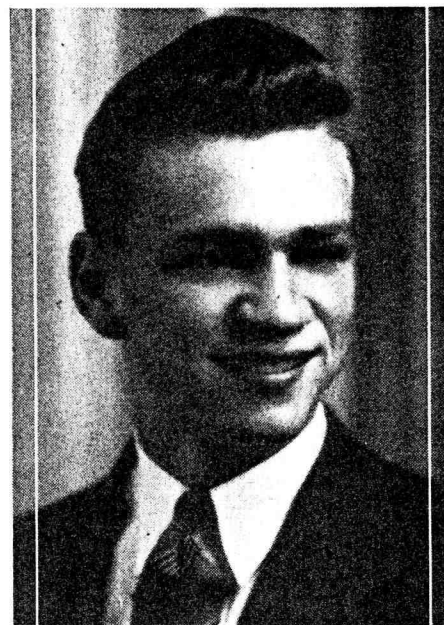

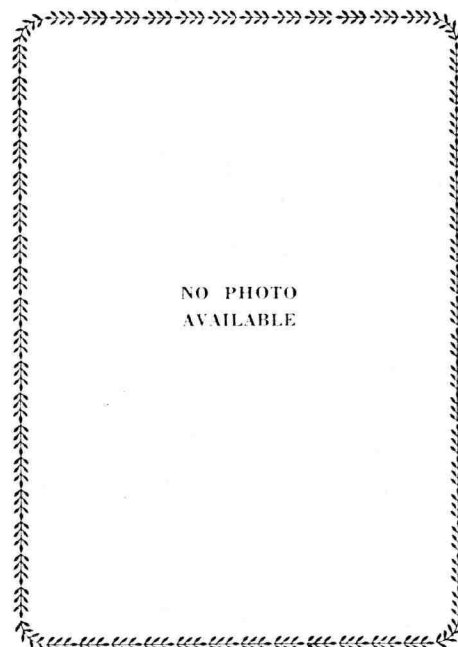

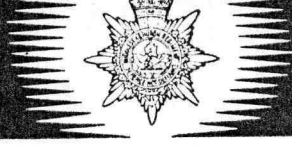
LEO LYNCH

HIS parents are Mr. and Mrs. Terrence Lynch, of Wallacetown. Enlisted in the R. C. A. F. at Windsor in May, 1941, for aircrew duties and graduated as an air gunner. He served in Canada for almost three years before proceeding overseas where, after operational training, he joined a Halifax bomber squadron of Bomber Command. P/O Lynch completed 17 operational trips, mainly to targets in the Ruhr, and including eight daylight raids. On his 18th flight his aircraft was shot down and he bailed out successfully near Magdeburg, and spent four months as a P. O. W. in Germany before being rescued. P/O Lynch was discharged in September, 1945.

BORN on December 23rd, 1922, in Detroit, Mich., and enlisted for active service in the American Army on June 27th, 1944. He went from America directly to France and was a member of the 90th Division Infantry of the American 7th Army under General Patton when it advanced through France and into Germany making a junction with the Red Army, and entering Czechoslovakia. He was with the regiment when they discovered 100 tons of gold bullion, 5,000,000,000 German Marks, 2,000 paintings, and \$2,000,000 in American currency hidden by the Nazis. He is at present stationed at Nurenberg in the Quarter Masters' Division.
