SON of Mrs. M. A. McAlpine and the late Mr. McAlpine, was born in Dunwich, May 29th, 1923. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve at Hamilton on October 15th, 1942, and was called to active service April 4th, 1943. He trained ashore in Canada at Hamilton and Cornwallis, N.S., before seeing much service overseas in the United Kingdom and France, while on board H.M.C.S. "Prescott," a Canadian Frigate. During this service he participated in "D" Day operations. After several months in Newfoundland, Bob was discharged November 2nd, 1945.

HIS parents, Mr. and Mrs. Dan McCaffery, live at Port Talbot. Enlisted in the R.C.A.F. August 11th, 1942, for air crew duties. He graduated as an air gunner at Mount Joli, Quebec, in May, 1943, and was posted to the United Kingdom. After three months operational training there, he joined 429 squadron as a gunner in a Halifax Bomber. During twenty-nine operational trips, twenty-four of which were to targets in Germany itself, F/O McCaffery was credited with two German aircraft probably destroyed. At the completion of his tour and the granting of a commission he instructed in England for six months before returning to Canada in February of 1945, and was discharged at Toronto in March of this year.

ERNEST A. McCAFFERY

SON of Mr. and Mrs. Dan McCaffery, resided near Port Talbot, prior to enlisting in the R. C. A. F. in June, 1943, as a Motorcycleist. He proceeded overseas to the United Kingdom in April of 1944, and was attached to 419 Repair Salvage Unit proceeding to France with the unit June 28, 1944. L. A. C. McCaffery moved up with the Canadian army through Brussels and Antwerp and into Holland. In January, 1945, L. A. C. McCaffery joined 410 R. C. A. F. night fighter squadron and was injured in a motorcycle accident near Tilburg in Holland. He was in a hospital in Belgium and at Fainborough, England, returning to Canada on the hospital ship "Letitia." Since his return L. A. C. McCaffery has completely recovered from his injuries.

JAMES CYRIL McCAFFERY

SON of Mr. and Mrs. Dan McCaffery, was born in South Dunwich near Port Talbot, and enlisted in the R. C. A. F. for flying duties in November, 1943. He was trained as an air gunner prior to proceeding to England in July, 1944. In the United Kingdom F/S McCaffery received operational training on a Lancaster aircraft and joined a Canadian heavy bomber squadron of No. 6 Group based mainly in Yorkshire. After completing 22 operational flights, including such targets as Berlin, his aircraft was damaged over Dresden and with two engines knocked out he was forced down in France. At the end of 1945, F/S McCaffery was at York, Yorkshire, awaiting repatriation to Canada.

SON of Mrs. and the late Mr. Malcolm D. McColl, of Dunwich, was born on November 7th, 1904, at Wallacetown, and enlisted on July 15th, 1941, with the R. C. E. M. E. and served in Canada till December 11th, 1944, when he left London for the United Kingdom. He served there till June, 1945, when he went to Germany to serve with the occupation forces, where he still is.

SON of Mrs. and the late Rev. Dr. MacDonald, formerly of Wallacetown, enlisted for active service on October 22nd, 1940, at London, Ont. In 1944 he reverted to the rank of Sapper and crossed to the continent where he served in Holland, France, Belgium and Germany. He was discharged on October 11th, 1945.



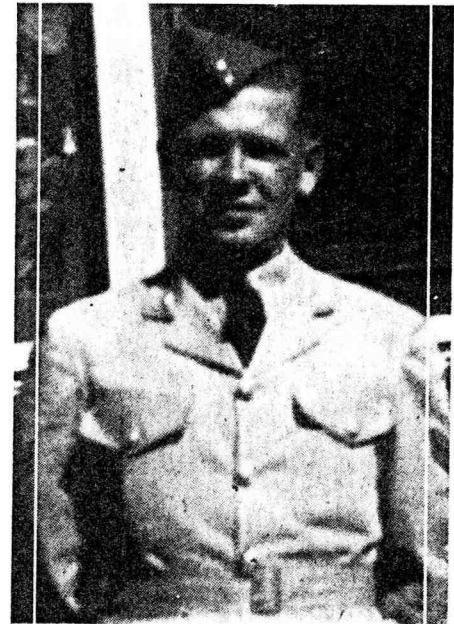
AUBREY MacDONALD

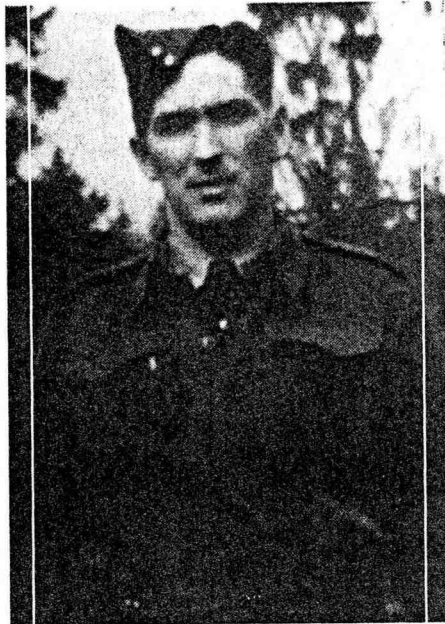
WALTER NELSON PURDY

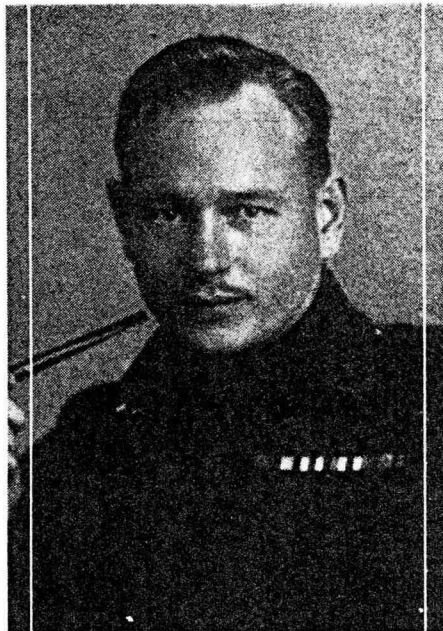


NORMAN RAPELJE

After seven months in Canada in the active army he went to the United Kingdom, serving four months in England and Scotland, then went to Sicily and Italy and on up to France and Germany. He returned to Canada and was discharged on November 10th, 1945.
