


Col. Talbot remembered

Re-enactment helps recall 190th anniversary of landing

TYRCONNELL (Staff) — Members of the Elgin Historical Society were out Wednesday night to commemorate Col. Thomas Talbot's landing 190 years ago.

To start off the evening, the Upper Thames Military Reenactment Society put up a display typical of the War of 1812. They had tents set up, had a brief discussion on what the living condition for soldiers were like at that time, and even served up steaming cups of bean soup.

After the display, the group moved across the street to the cemetery where Col. Talbot is buried. A short history was given, as well as a cannon salute by the re-enactment troop.

Afterward a short meeting of the society was held in the church. The original nave of the church was constructed in 1827 with the rest of the church being built in the following years.

The Storey House, just down the road from the church, was also open for the society to tour. It was built in 1850 and was one of the finest homes in the area. It is currently owned by the provincial government and is rumored to be up for sale.
