

Sades cucumber pickle
cut up cucumbers and soak
over night or 48 hrs. in salt
water. Make a weak vinegar
of 2 water & 1 vinegar to cover
them. Let scald and put in
jars and pour the following
syrup over them:

1 1/2 qts vinegar, 3 cups sugar
3 table spoons mixed pickling
spice in bag, 2 table spoons
celery seed 2 table spoons
mustard seed. boil 10 minutes
and pour over pickles
and seal.

Hoosier Cabinet

Manufactured by an Indiana Company from the early 1900's to the 1930's and featured a pull-out flour bin, tin lined bread drawer, spice rack, work surface, top cupboard for dishes and bottom area for pots and pans. The work surface on early models was made of wood or a nickel-steel alloy, later replaced by porcelain. They were generically referred to as 'Hoosiers' a nickname meaning "hill people" applied to Indiana residents. Price in early 1900's was \$13.25.

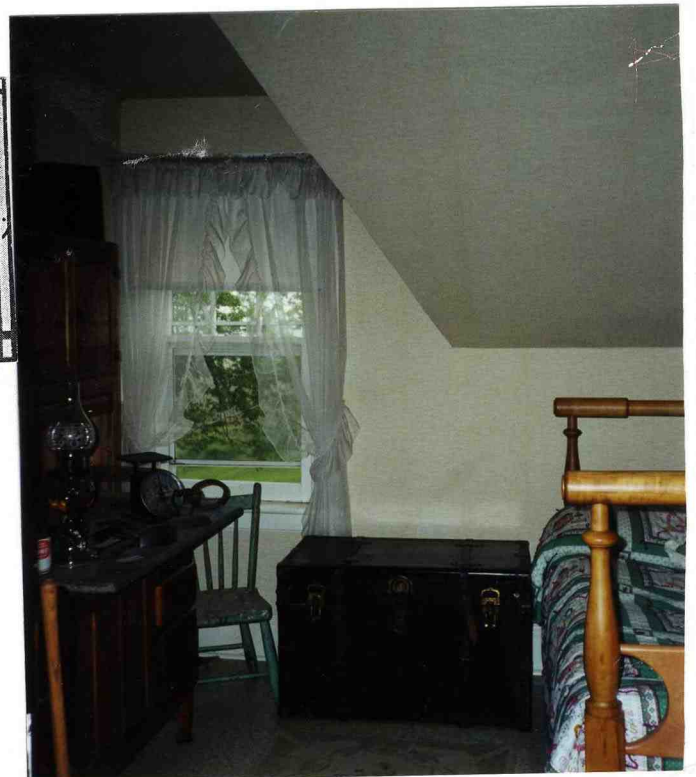


Library Book Stand
