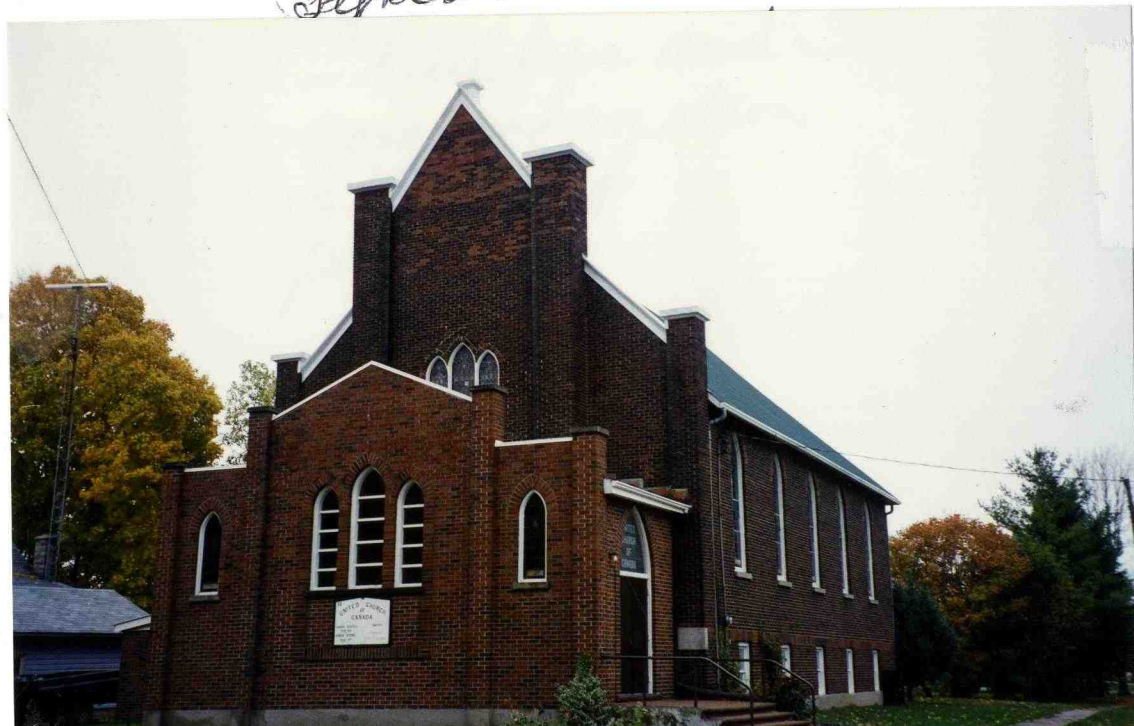


The dear old church of Happy Days June 19,

and were its Trustees

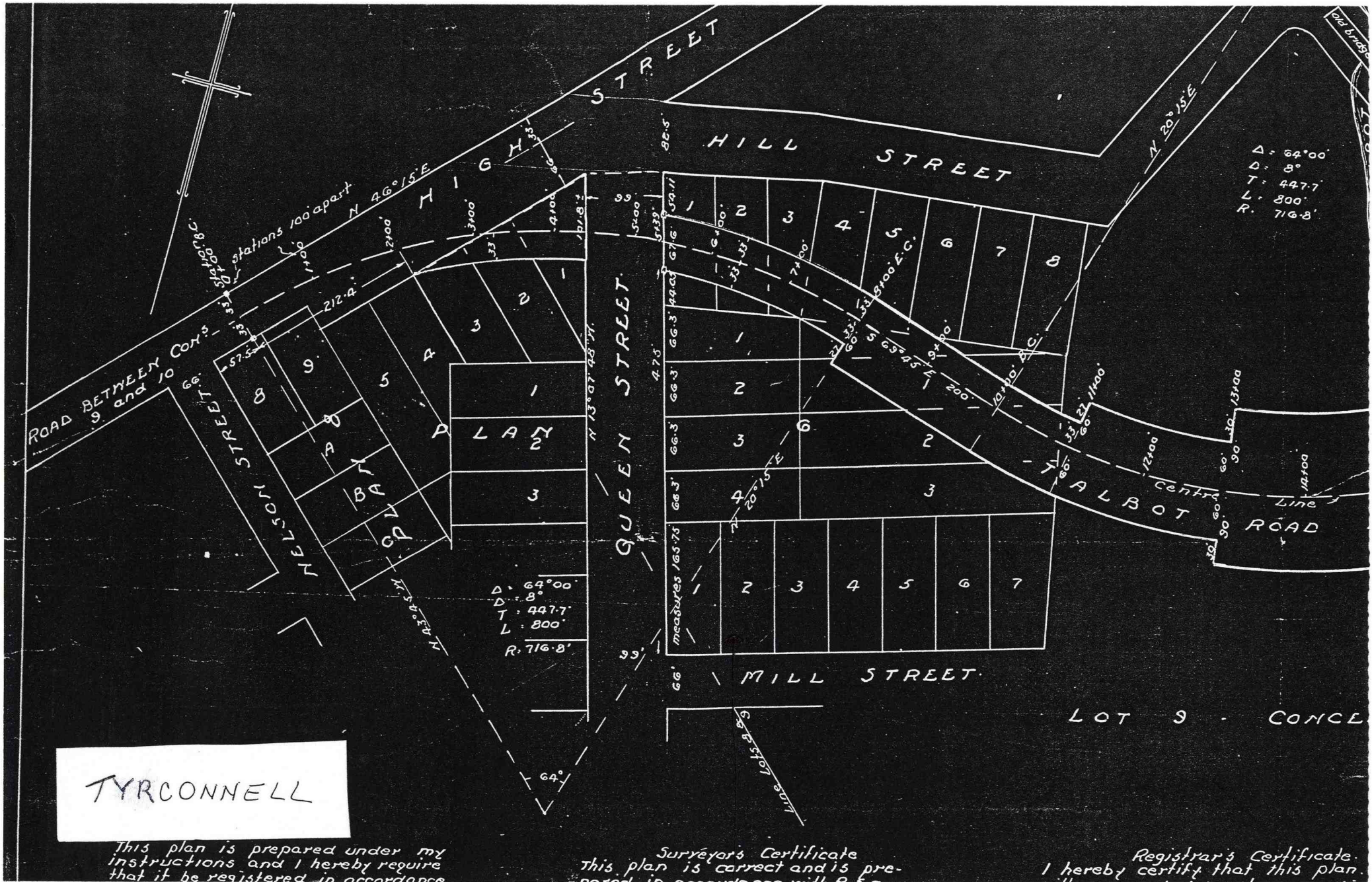
Jones Page Sr. led the
