This year's speaker is Crystal Mackay, known as a humorous, motivational speaker.

Three additional awards will be presented to area youth, related to agricultural backgrounds.

- received a letter from Aylmer Town Council lauding his contribution to

the community over the years.

ALISTAIR LITTLEJOHN

A familiar face in the Wallacetown area, Littlejohn served as EFA president in 1965 in addition to terms as president of the Junior Farmers in 1945, Elgin Soil & Crop in 1951 and Farmers Allied Meat Enterprise in 1964.

He served on numerous boards including the Elgin Cattlemen's Association, Ontario Wheat Producers, and Canadian Seed Growers' where for more than 50 years he was an elite seed grower.

In addition, Littlejohn was a founding member of the Ontario Swine AI Association in 1970.

In 1946 he captured the premier exhibitor award at the Elgin County Seed

Fair and the same year claimed the Victory Mills award for high soybean yield.



His knowledge proved invaluable in 1978 when he was the Canadian Seed Growers' representative to Russia and Eastern Europe.

His influence was felt far beyond the bounds of agriculture as he sat on Dunwich council and then as-

sumed the position of deputy reeve and then reeve.

He was a school board trustee in 1964 in addition to serving as a Bobier Home trustee and chairman from 1976-1988.

Littlejohn has been a member of the Odd Fellows Lodge for more than 50 years and a long-standing member of Cameron Lodge 232, Dutton, becoming master and district deputy in 1979.
