Tyler Duarte went to the Scandinavia Tournament in Finland and Sweden in April and his team never lost a game.

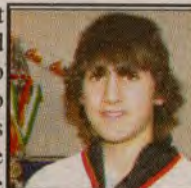

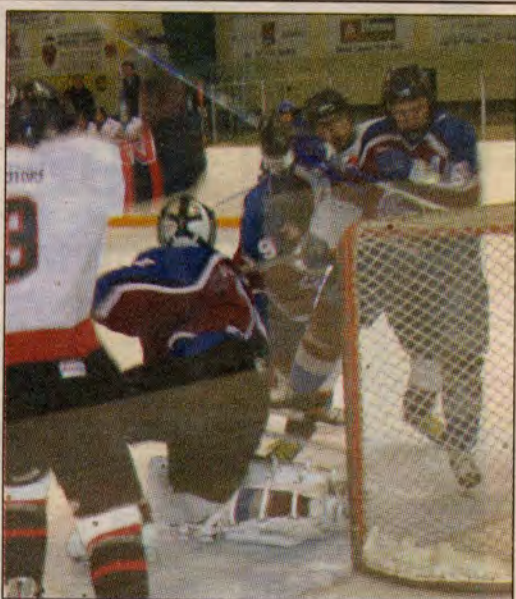
Girls House League Tournament

Hockey player from West Lorne sets record

West Lorne native Justin Azevedo holds a scoring record as he's led the Kitchener Rangers in goals with 43 and the OHL in assists with 81 in amassing his league leading 124 points.

Azevedo is five points ahead of runner-up Brett MacLean from the Oshawa Generals.

Azevedo is the first Ranger to win a scoring title since Dwight Foster won one in 1977.

As of March 14, Azevedo and the Kitchener Rangers set a franchise-

record of 53 wins in an Ontario Hockey League season with a 4-2 triumph over Sarnia.

No Rangers club in 45 seasons has managed that many victories. The closest was 52 back in 1983-84.

Azevedo had two goals and an assist March 14 leading up to his OHL-leading total of 124. Azevedo also led the OHL with 81 assists in 67 games.

In Kitchener, the Rangers took a 9-2 win over the Plymouth Whalers in the first game of their Western

Conference series March 21.

In Game two on March 24, the Rangers managed a 6-3 win over the Whalers. The win gives the Rangers a 3-0 lead in their Western Conference Quarter-Final Series..

The Rangers led 2-0 after the first period. Mike Duco scored the game's opening goal to give the Rangers a 1-0 lead.

Mikkel Boedker scored his first goal of the playoffs season on the power play. Justin Azevedo assisted on both goals.
