



Tarja Kleemola attends International Lutheran Women's Convention

Mrs. Tarja Kleemola of Grace Lutheran Church, West Lorne, joined approximately 9,000 convention delegates and guests attending the 50th Anniversary convention of the International Lutheran Women's Missionary League June 27-30 in Cleveland.

The convention's theme was "Celebrate the Jubilee! Glorify His Name!" Highlights included the celebration of the 50th anniversary, selection of mission projects, Bible study, featured speakers, Reach Out sessions, displays and tours.

A Historic Pageant guided conventioneers to "Remember" their history as they celebrate today. Missionaries from all around the world have returned to the United States to share in the historic occasion.

For the delegates, a convention highlight was the setting of a mission goal and selection of the mission projects for the biennium from the 23 proposed projects totalling \$1,380,000. Friday a special Thankoffering was gathered in celebration of the anniversary.

The ILWML has over 200,-000 members in the United States and Canada. From the beginning of the League, the emphasis has always been to

encourage and equip members to reach out in love, to provide opportunities for mission service and to gather funds for mission projects all over the world including the US and Canada.

Featured speakers included Dr. Raph Bohlmann, president of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and Dr. Glenn O'Shoney, executive director of LC-MS Board of Missions who informed the convention about the mission work of the church and challenged them to become more involved in the mission thrust to the world. Leading the daily Bible Study was Dr. Dale Meyer, "The Lutheran Hour" speaker. Dr. Paul Maier and Ms. Marilyn Bader were also featured speakers.

Six special "Reach Out" sessions Saturday afternoon featured visiting foreign missionaries, family life, evangelism, women and the church, and mission work in the church.

A Festival Service with communion closed the convention. Dr. Oswald Hoffmann, former Lutheran Hour speaker, was the preacher for the service and banners from each of the 45 United States and Canadian districts were displayed.

Grace Anglican congregation has good year in '73

The annual vestry meeting of Grace Anglican Church was held Jan. 23rd in the church hall, when Rector Brian Hold presided, and Barbara Inder. was again voted Vestry Clerk. Herb. Jim Black retained the office of treasurer, and expressed appreciation to all those, who, by their generous contributions, made it possible for the church to pay off its current debts -- the Diocesan budget, \$600 for sewage connection, and \$1,800 for repairs to the hall roof.

Other items of importance were discussed, and the Rector spoke of the possibility of having a mid-week Bible study with a Eucharist at Dutton and Port Stanley, if the people are interested.

REV. T. GODFREY INDUCTED INTO LOCAL 3-POINT CHARGE

A service of induction for the Rev. Tom Godfrey, as minister of Dutton, Wallacetown and West Lorne Presbyterian churches, was conducted by the Presbytery of London, on Sunday evening at St. Andrew's Church, Wallacetown.

Rev. Dr. Leslie Files of New St. James, London, and Moderator of Presbytery was in charge of the service. The sermon, "Living by the Grace of God", was delivered by Rev. Don McInnes of London.

Rev. David Clements, Interim Moderator, narrated the steps leading up to the call, followed by Preamble and questions from the congregations, Declaration of Induction, signing the formula, and the right hand of fellowship by members of Presbytery.

Rev. J.M. Pollack of Hamilton Rd. Church, London, gave the charge to the newly-inducted minister and to the congregations.

Following the closing hymn Rev. Godfrey pronounced the benediction.
