Former West Elgin resident earns top geological award

If you need to find Ed Sudicky these days, chances are you'll find him spending countless hours with his University of Waterloo grad students talking hydrogeology over a beer.

It is this dedication to his students, along well over 70 rearch papers he has published that the Geological Society of America awarded Sudicky with the prestigious O. E. Meinzer Award.

This international award is given once a year to the author of a published paper or body of work that advances the science of hydrogeology or some closely related field. Hydrogeology is the branch of geological sciences which is concerned with the character, source, occurrence, movement, availability of water.

"When I first learned that I

was to be this year's recipient of the Meinzer Award, you can't image how completely surprised and overwhelmed I was," says Sudicky, who received the award in GSA Annual Convention in Denver.

"I am indeed humbled that hose three papers will be in cluded in the impressive list of Meinzer Award papers."

Sudicky joined the UW faculty in 1985 and has worked his way to become a full professor and is now the chairman of the earth sciences department.

"Ed's teaching abilities have influenced a large number of students over the years. In Waterloo's porous media course Ed's lectures on stochastic approaches to dispersion initially blew most of us away," says Carl Mendoza, a professor at the

University of Alberta and a former Ph.D. student of Sudicky. "Ed is a terrific supervisor who cares deeply about his students. To a large degree the enthusiasm and ease with which Ed approached teaching led me to pursue an academic career

The specific paper which won Sudicky the awards dealt with heterogeneous and fractured media - or the way water and pollutants move through the

Sudicky was sure to recognize the major contribution of the paper's co-authors Darin Burr. Motomu Ibaraki and René Therrien, all former graduate stu-


"As Carl mentioned, many of my Ph.D. students have gone on to pursue productive academic careers supervising their own graduate students, and all of my former M.Sc. students are either making positive contributions in the consulting industry or have gone on to Ph.D. studies.," says Sudicky. "During their studies, I try to provide a research environment that is both stimulating and enjoyable, and as Carl noted, rather informal."

The preferred venue to meet with students is the Grad House.

"I want to thank my father, Andrew, who sadly passed away last year, and my mother Doris for all their support and encouragement," he says. "Dad never received a formal education, but was a very intelligent man who read books prolifically.

"I remember when I was still a graduate student and he paid one of his frequent visits to the university. While espousing his opinions about latest groundwater research directions in the presence of Bob Farvolden (professor) and I, Bob happened to mention to him that he thought that I was a pretty smart young student. Dad quickly turned to Bob and stated "that's because I taught Ed everything he knows". Thank you very much, Dad, for that educa-

This match was my most difficult as I was evenly matched with the Czech Republic fighter as we had very similar fighting styles. It was a back and forth match with the lead changing frequently. At the end of regulation we were tied.

This sent us into a one minute overtime where I came up just short and lost by a single point. I ended the tournament in third place and received a bronze medal. Like Stephanie, I too look forward to Austria in 2001.
