




Bands from east and west perform



The bands will perform some pieces together with Sharon Little and Dave Dykeman conducting.





Enns is first male CNE ambassador

Chris Enns, Ambassador of the Wallacetown Fair made history this week, being named the first male Ambassador of the Fair at the Canadian National Exhibition.

"I think it's a great adventure for him," said his mom, DJ Enns.

"He really wants to take it to heart and visit as many fairs as he can," she said Monday.

Chris couldn't be reached at deadline at his Toronto hotel Monday, while he was on a photo shoot for the fair.

Before being named Ambassador to the Fair, Chris won the congeniality title.

DJ said they knew he had the capability to win but when he was awarded the congenialty spot, she figured that was it.

Enns is an active member of the Wallacetown and Dutton-Dunwich community where he has been a member the Elgin Presbytery Youth Council and enjoys working with children and coaches basketball.

He is also a 4-H member and was a 2001 Ontario Beef Essay Contest winner, as well as the recipient of numerous awards in high school. He was also a member of the Thames Valley District School Board all-star basketball team and is certified in Basic American Sign Language.

According to a CNE media release, Enns is an excellent public speaker and has impressive writing skills, which went toward his win of the competition.

DJ said while serving as the ambassador is a priority to Enns, he is also dedicated to pursuing a career in biology at Dalousie University in Halifax before pursuing a career in medicine.

Also of note, the first runner-up was Shannon Thornicroft from the Glencoe Fall Fair.

Youth takes on challenges of chess, heading to world tournament in Greece

With pieces of paper, some markers and a single chapter in a book about games, eight-year-old Kevin Gibson taught himself how to play chess.

Two years later, he's qualified for a place on the Canadian Youth World Chess Team that will compete in Greece Oct. 22 to Nov. 3 "His first official chess set was

out of paper," said his mom, Ann Gibson, who never expected buying him that book would enter the family into the world of high-pressure chess tournaments.

Now Kevin is hoping to attain a master rating through tournament



Gibson bought Kevin the book while they were away on vacation two summers ago. Out of all the different games in the book, the complexities of chess are what drew his attention.


"There are so many different strategies, not like checkers where you just capture pieces. There's no real strategy," Kevin said. While other young children might


