



l. The home of Mr. and Mrs. Calvin Watson on County Road 52 at Radio Road is a well-preserved "mud walled" or adobe home which has since been covered with aluminum siding. Built about 1850 by William Baker it is one of two such homes in North Yarmouth.






2. Although it is hard to tell from this picture this home, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Keith Davis at R. R. 8 St. Thomas, was the first brick house in North Yarmouth township. The large structure was constructed by Duncan McGregor, an early Scottish emigrant, possibly as early as 1840. The home is located on Elgin County Road 52 and has now been covered with siding.







3. The home of Mr. and Mrs. G. Spurgeon and family on concession 13 of Yarmouth, just west of Highway 74 has a very unique pattern of brick work along the eaves as evidenced in this photo. The home was built in 1865 by Colin Campbell and is a Loyalist style home.



Mr. and Mrs. Percy Southern own this quaint little home on Concession ll of Yarmouth. Built between 1845 and 1860 by the Daniel Curtis family it sits on a farm which is still operated by the Curtis family.



4. This home built in 1857 by Carol Sinclair, is made of local brick and is distinctive because of its full two storeys and small panes of glass in the windows. The home was sold to Joshua Lewis in 1907 and was in the Lewis family until 1970 when it was sold to its present owners Mr. and Mrs. R. McLean. It is located on the 12th concession of Yarmouth west of Radio Road.



5. Robert Martin owns this lovely brick home which is another example of Gothic style. The rear section of the home was built about 1850 and the main brick portion in the 1860's. It is located on Edgeware Road north of Yarmouth Centre.



6. Mr. and Mrs. Robert Proud are the owners of this house located on Radio Road and built in 1865 by James Locke. A distinctive feature of the home is the large fan transom over the front entrance.
