



Immunization – Influenza Vaccine, Pneumococcal Vaccine and Antiviral Therapy

Consent Form - Residents

Immunization annually against influenza is advised as pneumonia can develop in some cases of influenza. In addition, immunization against pneumococcus can help prevent pneumonia in the elderly.

INFLUENZA VIRUS VACCINE is an active immunizing agent given by injection. The vaccine helps to prevent infection by the influenza viruses that are included in each year’s vaccine.

PNEUMOCOCCAL VACCINE is an active immunizing agent given by injection. This vaccine helps to prevent a particular for of pneumonia that can have serious effects in the elderly. The vaccine does not need to be given yearly.

Along with their needed effects, both vaccines may cause some unwanted effects. The following side effects may occur:

- Tenderness, redness or hard lump at the place of injection
- Mild fever, unusual tiredness or weakness, or aches and pain in muscles

The following are symptoms of an allergic reaction:

- Difficulty breathing or swallowing
- Hives: itching especially hands and feet
- Swelling of eyes, face or inside nose
- Unusual tiredness or weakness (sudden and severe)

ANTIVIRAL THERAPY – Antiviral therapy may be recommended by the Medical Officer of Health to be given to the residents of Long Term Care Homes during a confirmed influenza A outbreak.

Antiviral Therapy Contraindications: Tamiflu – known sensitivity to Tamiflu, kidney disease, pregnancy
