

SOUTHWESTERN PUBLIC HEALTH WEARING MASKS ON PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION



Using public transportation may not allow the physical distance needed to lower the spread of COVID-19. Here is guidance for wearing masks to keep each other safe.

BY AIR

Passengers are advised to wear non-medical masks or face covering whenever possible, and are required to cover their mouth and nose:

- At Canadian airport screening checkpoints
- On flights with limited physically distancing
- When directed by a public health order or airline employee



No mask or face covering? No flight*.

**Children under two years of age and those with underlying medical conditions may be exempt.*

BY WATER, RAIL OR ROAD

Passengers are advised to wear non-medical masks or face covering whenever possible, especially when physical distancing can't be maintained.

Confirm if the operator (e.g. bus company) requires proof of a mask or face covering before boarding.
